


# 30TH OCTOBER THE BEATIFICATION OF BROTHERS MUTIEN AND MIGUEL

"Lives of great men still remind us. We can make our life sublime."

On the 30th October, 1977, a memorable ceremony was held in St. Peter's Square. Two educators Brother Miguel and Brother Mutien Marie were beatified for devoting all their energies to the guidance and education of young people. Both of them faced the challenges of life undaunted. With obedience, humility, devotion and sacrifice as the guiding principles of their lives, they succeeded in bringing mankind closer to love, peace and true happiness.

Francisco Febres Cordero was born in Cuenca, Ecuador, on 7th November, 1854 with deformed feet. His life has been an example of fighting against odds, persisting in his will in spite of all opposition. He was the first pupil of the La Salle Brothers when they opened a school at Cuenca. Being intellectual and desirous of learning, he was always at the head of his class. When his parents objected to his wish to join the congregation and become a Brother, he obeyed but suffered a lot as his heart was set on this goal.

Finally, Francisco Febres Cordero entered the novitiate under the name of Brother Miguel. He worked in the school at Quito for more than 40 years. He had composed text books. He was an esteemed poet, unanimously elected member of the Academy of Ecuador, and the Royal Spanish Academy.

'How happy a person will be if, like me now on the brink of the grave, he can say that he has had a great devotion to our Lady.' He understood well what Alexander Pope meant when the poet said, 'Honour and shame from no condition rise.

Act well your part, there all the honour lies.'

Louis Joseph Wiaux was born at Mellet near Gosselies, Belgium on 20th March, 1841. He grew up with a strong sense of determination. Intuitively he knew that he was destined to join the Congregation of St. John Baptist de La Salle. He could not turn a deaf ear to the call of duty. It was loud and clear. When he was 15, he was admitted into the Novitiate at Namur. Then, he was accepted as a member of the religious order under the name of Brother Mutien Marie. It was not all smooth sailing for him; God wanted him to weather storms. After he was given the 7th class in the boarding school of Malone, the Community Council did not grant his request to make his temporary vows. He was considered unsuitable to be a

Brother of the Christian Schools. He was confined to inferior tasks but he neither flinched nor grumbled nor protested. He was a great man. He had no false idea of the dignity of labour. Brother Mutien was made to learn to play musical instruments. For more than fifty-six years he kept on practising. To him good deeds was everything, fame was nothing.

However harsh it was for him, he never turned his back on the call of duty. He followed the orders of his superior humbly, ignoring his had health. He obeyed orders so well that young Brothers of the Malone community who came to find a fault in him remained to praise. At 4:30 in the morning, he was found kneeling and praying at the altar.

Only an order from his superior could makes him give up his daily work. However, his health failed him. On 30th January, 1917 he surrendered his soul to God. He declared in all humility.

He devoted himself enthusiastically to Catechetics and his favourite task was to prepare children for first communion. He fulfilled this apostolate from 1880 to 1907 during which time he made close contact with young boys which left a characteristic mark of simplicity on his mind.

Then as a result of religious persecution Superiors called on him to leave his native land and go to Belgium to prepare European Brothers who were not allowed to carry on their work in their own countries to teach in South America. Hence they had to learn Spanish. Soon the ravages of the cold, damp climate began taking toll of his health and he was transferred to Spain where he got caught in a revolution.

Brother Miguel brought with him the sacred host from the chapel of Premia to save it from profanation. After the revolution, he returned to Premia de Mar with deteriotated health.

The malady from which he had suffered in Paris and in Belgium, the fatigues suffered in Spain and the accelerated rhythm of his work, began to take their toll. As a result, a cold he had caught degenerated into double pneumonia and he died.

## SPORTS REPORT

Even though we have only four championship banners to show for the season just ending, this has been our most successful year ever. Besides the championship banners we also brought home seven runners-up banners and two third place banners. At the time of writing we have already reached more than sixty points in the Omega table and this will put us well within the top three or four schools for sport in Hong Kong. In fact the championship trophies we won this year were all first time achievements, in that we had never won them before. As has become standard now for the past few years we entered full teams in the five competitions organised by the Christian Brothers Schools Sports Association and in seven major sports run by the Hong Kong Schools Sports Association. Needless to say we had the usual inter class competitions and we also entered some other competitions besides the above. A full break down of all our results can be found at the end of this report.

#### ATHLETICS

Turning now to our results in each sport and taking them in alphabetical order we start with Athletics. In the Inter-Collegiate Meet, held during Chinese New Year at the Government Stadium, we had the satisfaction of dethroning the traditional champions, La Salle, in both A and B Grades while our C Grade team took runners-up position to La Salle really pleasing results. Following the Inter-Collegiate we sent our teams back to the Stadium in March to compete in the Inter-School meet and the effects of the Mid-year exam, held in the two weeks poor to the Meet, were soon obvious when, at the end of the first day, we were in second last place. However, on the second and Final days our teams rallied and slowly but surely we lifted ourselves until we finished in fourth place overall. The result was a bit disappointing especially after our success in the Inter-Collegiate but we did bring home some medals and broke six of our own records.

#### **BADMINTON**

One sports in which we had very high hopes at the beginning of the season was Badminton because we had nearly all of last year's players still with us and good C Grade coming up. Possibly because of over-confidence, our hopes did not materialise and our results were not what they should have been. The A Grade team failed to make the Final round, while the B Grade team having entered the final six and beaten the then League leaders, Ng Wah, turned in two dismal performances against La Salle and Pui Ching to end up in Third place. The C Grade team also finished in Third place, having lost to La Salle and DBS in the Final round. In all fairness to the C Grade team it must be said that La Salle and DBS were better than us and were worthly winners.

#### BASKETBALL

Compared with last year's results our basketball teams did not do quite so well: this does not mean our results were bad — they were good, it is just that last season our results were very good. A Grade failed to make the final round for the

first time in many years but to make up for that our C Grade team did make the final four and finished runners-up to a very good Lee Kau Yau team in both the League and Knock-out. Our B Grade team avenged the double defeat suffered by the C Graders when they beat Lee Kau Yan to win the B League for the first time ever. In the Knock-out Final, again against Lee Kau Yan, luck was not with us and we failed to take the double — thus ending the season with one trophy and three runners-up banners.

#### CROSS COUNTRY

Without any doubt the sport in which we made most progress this year was Cross Country. This is a sport which is increasing in popularity very quickly and this season saw seventeen Schools competing in the Kowloon Championships at Fanling in December. Our results were the best ever with both C and B Grade coming second with A Grade in fourth place. Our C Grade success was all the sweeter when we realised that the traditional champions, KGV, were in fact below us in third place. Following this success we entered a team in the Police Sports Club Round Hong Kong Island cross country relay race. Twelve school teams and courteen senior teams took part in this twenty five mile race and with our mixed team of A. B. and C Graders we were placed fourth in the schools section and twelfth overall. Then on February 1st, our teams returned to Fanling for the Inter School Championships and this time our C Grade team rose to the occasion by outrunning the rest of the field to bring back the Overall Champions shield. B and A Grade were not quite up to it, no doubt because of our Inter Class Athletics Finals held the same morning (the third year in a row that both have clashed!), and came home in fourth place. Not only did our C Grade team win the Overall Trophy, we also filled four of first six individual places, with Chan Sai Keng (3B), in second place Tam Kwok Keung (2D) in third place, Chan Kin Fung (2A) fifth and so Kwok Kit (2D) sixth - a very good effort indeed.

#### **FOOTBALL**

Turning now to what is the most popular sport in school but the one in which we have had least success in Inter School competitions - Football. For once, it is nice to be able to say that one of our teams survived the first round and made it into the second round. Yes, this year our Football is beginning to show some progress for not only has the C Grade team reached the second round they have gone on to quality for the Final Round along with three other teams. At the time of writing the Final Round has yet to begin but the team spirit is high and there is no reason why we shouldn't give La Salle, Moral and KGV, the traditional finalists in C Grade, a good lesson by bringing back the Shield for the first time. Unfortunately the revival in C Grade was not repeated by our A and B teams as we again failed to make the second round.

#### SWIMMING TABLE-TENNIS

After last year's Swimming successes in Division Two we found ourselves competing with the best in Division One this year. Swimming against Schools equipped with their own pools or whose students have access to private clubs and pools was no easy matter and when we set out for the Meet at Victoria Park Pool we were not over confident. It was soon obvious that we were not up to Division One standard and at the end of the Finals we were second last in the Overall standings and will be back in Division Two again in the coming year. Despite being relegated we turned in some fine performances and during the two days of competition five of our records were broken.

Last in the list of sports comes Table Tennis and once again the report is disappointing. We had three teams in the Inter School competitions but all failed to reach the second round. The annual Inter Collegiate competition has yet to be held and we hope we can show some improvement there.

Looking back over the year it is immediately clear that most of our success has been with the C Grade teams — Cross Country Champions, Basketball Double Runners-up, Badminton Third, Athletics Fourth and Football in the Final Four. In fact half our Omega Points have come from C Grade teams. This is indeed most encouraging because without good foundations at the bottom we cannot hope to be good with our Senior teams. Congratulations, therefore, to all our teams, but especially to the C Graders for their results. Let us hope that the spirit we now have with C Grade will go up with them to B and A Grades so that in a few years time we can open our Sports Report with an announcement that the Omega Rose Bowl is on its way to CSK!


spiritual director, gives sermons to help us acquire religious knowledge.







- 3. A Mathematics Olympiad took place for form four students.



# PARENTS TEACHERS ASSOCIATION











The concept of School Social Work may be new to many teachers and students, but in fact some local voluntary welfare agencies have been providing School Social Work service in Hong Kong since 1971. Direct Government service, a joint project by the Education Department and the Social Welfare Department, was introduced in late 1974. In October 1977, it was expanded to provide School Social Work service to 85 government/subsidized schools (31 secondary schools and 54 primary schools) using 17 full-time social workers deployed fromt the Social Welfare Department. Each social worker who is responsible to serve 5 schools is stationed in each school one day a week.

The Government's Green Paper on the Development of Personal Social Work Among Young People in Hong Kong issued in November 1977 stresses that symptoms of maladjustment and difficulties for whatever reasons must be identified and treated as early in the young person's life as possible if he or she is to have a chance of overcoming them. School Social Work is an application of social work principles and methods in the school setting. It is designed to help students to overcome difficulties which may hinder their academic, social and emotional development; and otherwise, to assist them to make the maxium use of their educational opportunity and to enable



them to develop their potential to the fullest extent. In doing so, it is hoped to prevent students from developing anti-social and criminal behaviour and at the same time to encourage the formation of desirable and socially acceptable attitudes.

Even with the introduction of school social work service, the teachers are still playing an important role in guiding students in their education, behavious and the development of desirable social attitudes. The teachers, by virtue of their training and daily contacts with their students, should be able to handle the learning difficulties and be-

havious problems of the students. It is only when the problems are beyond the resources of teachers that assistance from the school social worker is sought. The school social worker, by virtue of his professional training and knowledge of the available welfare resources, is more competent to handle students', problems related to family relationships, financial, emotional and social problems which are of a more complicated nature. When he comes across students with poor intelligence, mental retardation or serious emotional and behaviour problems, he may refer them to the Special Education Section of the Education Department for therapeutic help, or placement in a special training centre.

As the teachers have daily contact with the students, they are in a better position to identify students who have problems. If they wish, they can discuss problems with the school social worker before making proper referral fo rservice. Students who have identified their own difficulties can also approach the school social worker direct for possible service. Since the introduction of the

school social work service in this school in October 1977, the response from the student population in general is considered satisfactory. From time to time students approach me personally for enquiries or discussions concerning their difficulties. The Principal and other teaching staff have also referred students with problems for appropriate service. The problems which I have handled over this period involve family relationship problems, financial difficulties, emotional disturbance and anxiety about future careers. With the school authority's consent, I gave a brief talk on social work to the members of the School's Social Service Group in January, 1978.

As the school social work service is something new to this school, it is anticipated that it will take time for the students, teaching staff and school personnel to gain a thorough understanding of the scope of its work and to make use of it in the students' best interest. Anyhow, it is a delight to note that more students are becoming aware of such a service and are ready to make the best use of it.

# Interview With Mr. B. K. Lee

Mr. B.K. Lee is one of the experienced teachers of the school. He has been teaching in C.S.K. since its establishment. We had an informal talk with him in the lecture room after school and it lasted for about two hours.

Mr. Lee has four sisters and one brother and he is the eldest in his family. He had studied in a number of primary schools due to financial difficulties. In about 1954, he transferred from St. Mattew's Evening Primary School to day school where he completed his primary education. Before leaving the school, he took part in the Secondary School Entrance Examination and was assigned to Clementi Middle School, a Chinese Secondary School. About half a year later he stopped going to school because his family could not afford to pay the school fees. However, finally with the help of his form-master, he was able to continue his study. In J.M.2, his formmaster help him to apply for government aid for his study and was successful in getting it, he was able to finish his secondary school course. His only ambition at that time was to be a primary school teacher. He had never dreamed of studying in any university. In S.M.3, he took the School Certificate Examination and got credits in six subjects out of ten. Then he appeared for the Joint Colleges Examination and was admitted to United College and succeeded in applying government bursary. He majored in mathematics and minored in physics.

After four years of hard work he graduated and the degree of Bachelor of Science was conferred on him. Before he came to C.S.K. he had taught in a secondary school on Hong Kong side for two years.


In his opinion, C.S.K. has progressed a lot academically and in the field of sports. He also pointed out that the Certificate of Education Examination result of C.S.K. was quite good but the matriculation result is not very satisfactory for the Certificate of Education Examination is an examination which calls for basic knowledge of various subjects. It is not difficult to pass the Certificate of Education Examination if one works hard. However, the matriculation examination is different. It requires more originality and imagination. In order to get better results, Mr. Lee advised the students to study in groups. Students must not be selfish; instead they should exchange their experience and concepts with one another.

Mr. Lee enjoys teaching very much. He finds that it is a challenging occupation. He firmly believes that students should be provided with a place where they can study and learn how to get along with others in society. Schools should help students to cultivate their critical thinking and help them to build up character. He also pointed out that it is useless to punish students. A better way to help a student is to give him advice. Finally, he emphasised that it is good to take part in extra-curricular activities. However, any kind of excess should be avoided. And, it would be better to really participate in one or two activities rather than a member in name only in many clubs' and societies'.

# C.S.K. Joins Unique World Wide "Club"





# 我要做!





- b 同年七月,團員繆振聲參加傷健 渡假營。該次服務是爲那羣傷殘 兒童安排一個歡樂暑假。
- c 去年八月間,多名會員被派往各 主要碼頭、火車站調查香港市民 對急救及家居安全知識的認識。 這次調查,將爲提供未來方針的 資料。
- d 又同年八月二十日,本團受總會 所委託,在香港傷健協會舉辦之 傷健之夜負責維持秩序,派發場 刊及協助表演者上落舞台。
- e 十月二十九日多名團員參予慈氏 安養院售旗籌款。

# 跆拳道

近年香港人熱衷學習的自衞術之一 — 跆拳道(TAE KWON-DO),這是一種韓國武術,攻擊力絕不遜色於中國功夫、空手道或其他武術。

本校跆拳道運動的熱潮是由數十位熱愛此種運動的同學 發起,自一九七五年暑假至今已有三年歷史。跆拳道的精神 主要在鍛鍊各學員得到强健的體魄、敏捷的身手和堅忍刻苦 的耐能。自成立至今 ,訓練從未苟且 。 逢星期二、四放學 後,一羣熱愛跆拳運動的學員便在飯堂前的空地練習。每次 均由兩位或以上教練指導下進行。
