

SAINT BROTHER MIGUEL
OF THE CHRISTIAN SCHOOLS

21st Oct., 1984 was a memorable day for the Christian Brothers in being the day for the canonisation of Brother Michael Cordero. A Thanksgiving Mass in commemoration of the occasion was held in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on 23rd Oct., 1984. During the mass, Brother Raphael Egan (Associate Visitor of Hong Kong) gave a talk on the life of Bro. Michael.

The following is his speech:

Your Excellency Bishop Wu, Rev. Fathers, Sisters, Brothers, Pupils, Old Boys & Friends:

On behalf of the La Salle Brothers I welcome you here this evening to join us in thanking God for the great honour — the highest in the Church — accorded to a humble servant of the Lord, Br. Michael Cordero, on the occasion of his canonisation which took place in Rome two days ago.

For information about Br. Michael I refer you to the very fine article by Fr. Birmingham in the last edition of the Sunday Examiner. Please pick up a pamphlet on the same subject at the door as you leave this service. My short talk this evening will be addressed to the two main parts of the congregation viz. teachers and pupils.

Br. Michael was a warm and lovable person both as boy & man. I shall not dwell on those aspects of his life which from a worldly point of view gave him a claim to greatness e.g. his family background, his brains and erudition, his fame as a writer or as a poet: for none of these has the Church honoured him. His greatness lies in the faithful following of his vocation both as a Brother and as a teacher, the total and absolute dedication of his life, talents and energy to the furthering of God's Kingdom.

His life is full of hope and consolation for teachers be they cleric religious or lay. At a time like now when the classroom is being abandoned for other forms of the apostolate, it is good to recall that the Church has put its seal on the teaching apostolate by placing Br. Michael before us as our model, as one who attained the highest sanctity through his witness and example as a teacher of religion and of profane subjects.

There is little glamour attached to the life of a teacher. It is humdrum and exacting. The day is regulated by the bell and by the demands of some 40 pupils at any one time: the life demands patience, insight and forbearance, humility and regularity. Br. Michael encountered all the obstacles that are the lot of the average teacher. Thrown into class while still a teenager he had disciplinary problems at first. These he overcame by persistent efforts and became a model teacher, loving, kind, respected and efficient. A contemporary of his states that so lucid were his explanations and so clear was his presentation that other teachers eavesdropped at his door to try and see what the secret was. His respect for the person of his pupils was indeed admirable. He says, "Whenever possible, I will call children by their baptismal name in order to respect in them their sublime character as children and sons of God."

Br. Michael taught remedial classes for a number of years. He scrupulously prepared his lessons. Once a confrere remonstrated with him and asked, "Why do you have to prepare these lessons since you have been teaching them for years?" In reply Br. Michael said, "If I taught the same lesson for 30 years I would still prepare it because each time I find that there is a better method of presenting it than the one I used last time!" His first and greatest love was teaching Catechism and preparing pupils for First Holy Communion. A protrait of Br. Michael painted in his native Ecuador shows him preparing such a group of children and the title under the picture reads — "Br. Michael Apostle of First Holy Communion."

Who can doubt that Br. Michael who while on earth knew all the joys and hardships of a teacher, will not answer the prayers of those teachers who ask his intercession in their trials and difficulties?

The second point I wish to make, because of its relevance to contemporary Hong Kong, is the difficulty Br. Michael experienced in his attempt to follow his vocation. He loved his teachers and from very early in life wanted to become a Brother. What an uproar this decision created in his burgeois family. His father and uncle held very high positions in the army. They had influence enough and sufficient patronage to get him a Commission in spite of his disability. In any case there was the Church where his brilliance, powers of oratory, and genuine piety would surely see him rise to great eminence. So thought his relatives and especially his grandmother. What a waste to let him join a band of foreigners who had come from Europe and who spoke Spanish with a non-too acceptable accent. Besides they lived a poor life, had their schools in poor areas and taught mostly poor children. His parents took him out of school and sent him to the seminary


in the hope he would be a priest. Obediently he went, but was not happy in spite of all the kindness shown him. His health deteriorated and the Rector told his parents he should leave and rejoin his school. Later he joined the Brothers and had the great sorrow of being disowned by his father and experienced much coolness from his relatives. But with God's help and guidance he persevered.


Can we not see the struggle of Br. Michael to follow his vocation reflected yearly and daily in our Catholic Community? Parents here would not dream of directing their child to the army: it is a great pity that even the Priesthood is not highly rated among their priorities. The hard and demanding life of a priest holds out no worthwhile worldly prospects for an aspiring candidate. The hope of becoming a Bishop is after all only one in 5 million, not a lot better than the Mark 6. Becoming a Brother or a Sister will not bring much if indeed any glory or fame to a young boy or girl contemplating the religious life. Eternal values are forgotten and only earthly ones considered.

Become a doctor, an engineer, a lawyer and the world lies open before you! A girl with a good degree will bring glory to the family also if she succeeds and goes on to become a lecturer, a Professor or a public figure in Legco. These are the prospects held out to young girls and boys who express the promptings of a vocation. How often have we seen and still see incipient vocations snuffed out by parents and relatives as soon as they become serious talking points.

Yet who is remembered today in Ecuador? Presidents, famous generals have a line or two in history books. Br. Michael's family would not even be heard of were it not for their son. Yet when Br. Michael died a day of national mourning was declared in his native country. To you my dear young friends here at Mass to-day I say, "Do not let obstacles prevent you from following your vocation should you hear the call of God. Have great trust in Him and in Mary his mother. Ask Br. Michael to help you and you will overcome."

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

International Youth Year

You are what you make of yourself. Your Parents, the circumstances of your birth and upbringing contribute but the really decisive factor is yourself.

From an early age most people have some idea of what they want to do with their lives. Each has an image of what he would like to be thought of by himself and the people with whom he comes into contact. He forms an ideal; this ideal has to be adapted, purified and made one's own.

We admire attractive qualities of nobility, greatness, goodness shown in moments of crisis or in the day to day practice of virtuous living. These qualities did not drop from the sky. They have to be cultivated. Reflection and observation help. Learn correct principles on which to direct one's life and apply them independently of circumstances, feelings, passions; failure to do so is to be inconsistent and irresponsible. To succeed you need a strong will.

A strong will is defined as one that strives constantly, towards a self-chosen goal, for one's own personal motives. It is not the eagerness with which one sets out but the constancy with which one continues in the face of difficulty, monotony and frustration that counts.

Parents, friends, teachers, acquaintances can help, but also hinder; passions too can help but must be integrated into the personality or it is no longer you.

Motives must be personal, made your own, lasting, neated in the intellect and will, comprehensive, covering all actions and embracing as many valves as possible-pleasurable, vital, social, spiritual and religious and conscious-always borne in mind.

This is where International Youth Year begins for all-at home with you, inside, your character, your contribution. You are what you make yourself.

To educate young people is to form the future, for youth is the future, theirs and ours. They must begin to build it, not just dream about it. It is our task to encourage and help them. The following quotation from the letter of Pope John Paul II to the Congress of the O.I.E.C. in February, 1982, could sum up and conclude this article:

"The youth of today, fascinated by the progress of modern science, is tempted to accord to science unlimited confidence and to regard it as the supreme value. It is essential, therefore, that the Catholic School show its pupils that the progress of humanity is not measured solely by scientific and technological progress. True progress lies in the priority given to spiritual values and to moral progress. The basically unjust conditions encountered in a materialistic society result in a situation where some live in abundance while others die of hunger. To remedy this evil a new world order is needed and, consequently, an education in the values of justice and love which are its foundation. In a secularized society which has lost the sense of the sacred and with it the sense of morality, there is an urgent need for an education in religious values, an education which enable its beneficiaries to discover the call of faith. It is the duty of the Catholic School to awaken the young to the interior life in such a way that they may be able to answer the call of faith with enthusiasm and generosity". (Pope John Paul II — Letter to the O.I.E.C. — February, 1982.)

SPORTS REPORT

Bamboo scaffolding, green netting and a record in Inter-school athletics are the highlights of the season — the first two caused serious disruption to our sports programme, while the latter was a source of pride and inspiration. The scaffolding and nets meant that the school building was about to undergo major repairs and in turn we lost the use of the hall for over a month and the playground for over four months. Needless to say our basketball, badminton, pingpong and volleyball teams and competitions all suffered as a result. However in sports not affected by the closure of the playground we continued to do well and showed some improvement. Full results of all inter class and inter school competitions will be found at the end of this report.


Looking at our results over the past year it is clear that, with the exception of swimming, our A grade results were the worst ever. It is a pity that the spirit that carries our B and C teams to success seems to be lacking when A grade wear our colours. In swimming our A grade team did very well to capture the Kowloon Div. III trophy and their points together with C grade's third place and B grade's fourth were enough to give us the Div. III overall trophy and promotion to Div. II again. The swimming club now has some fifty members training twice a week at La Salle pool, so hopefully we can expect better results in the future.

While we failed to capture any trophies in the ball games we did stay in Div. I in both basketball and football with our B grade teams finishing third and sixth respectively and the C grade teams both in fourth place. In Div. II volleyball both teams reached the final rounds and again our C team were fourth with B in fifth place.

Turning to racquet games, our badminton teams did well even though the hall was closed for a month early in the season. Overall we placed fourth in Div. I with A in sixth place, B in fifth and C again in fourth. The ping pong teams missed the use of the hall for training far more than we realised and as a result we remain in Div. II for we failed to reach the final rounds with any team.

Finally we come to track and field events and here we did have some good results, especially in B grade. In athletics we won our first ever banner in B grade when we finished in third place. We also set a

new B grade inter school record, in fact the only B grade record set in the entire championships, when Ng Kwok Hung improved on the old shot put record of 14.75m with a throw of 15.09m. Unfortunately our A grade team could not repeat the success of B and finished in second last place while C grade turned in some good results from last year's D grade champions to finish in seventh place. Cross country produced our best results of the year when our B team captured the double for the first time. They captured the Div. I trophy with a very good run on the new course at the Police Cadet School and then went on to win the championship trophy on the Royal Hong Kong Golf Club course. Again both A and C teams were disappointing as they finished in second last place.








beneficial. Furthermore, we cooperated with the Prefectorial Board in the Science Quiz Competition.



Our Executive Committee has also planned many activities in the near future:


- 1. More lectures will be given on photography.

This has been the first year of our Library Assistants' Society. As one of the aims of our society, we want to have a better organized library in our school, so all of our members act as assistants in order to help the Teacher Librarian to run our library.

We have several kinds of work everyday. Firstly, some assistants help our schoolmates to borrow and return books from library. Secondly, other assistants check all the books that are borrowed from the library. They ensure that all the books which are damaged can be selected out and repaired. Moreover, we help the Teacher Librarian to record the new books. Finally, we have the obligation to maintain discipline in the library.

During this year we have reformed the on-duty system of our library assistants, so we spent a large part of our man power in doing this. Therefore, it seems that no external activity has been organized. We hope this situation can be improved in the future. We are going to organize a picnic for our members in the coming summer holidays and we want to have some visits to other schools' libraries also.

In conclusion, it has been a hard year for us due to the many difficulties we faced. But we all try our very best to overcome them. At last, we would like to thank our members, teacher advisor and all of our schoolmates, because they have been very helpful in the running of our society.

Reconstruction Works

Our school was opened in September, 1969. This 15-years' history has contributed to the ageing of the school building. So, it has been under large-scale repair throughout the last school year. Scaffolding has been up around the school building since the late November. The work is still in progress. These works include:

- (1) renewal of the roof in the classroom blocks and the hall because the roof was leaking.
- (2) mending of fins since the rainfall had got into the cement and rusted the iron causing spalling.
- (3) the painting of external windows and iron works: this is routine maintenance work.
- (4) the strengthing of slope facing Sheung Shing Street so as to ensure its security.
- (5) the renewal of switches and the improvement of lights so as to improve illumination.

The expenditure on these works will be over two million and it is paid for by the Government through the Education Department. There will be no new facilities installed in the reconstruction works because of the inadequate space. However, the fixed benches in the Geography Room will be changed to movable desks during the summer holidays.

A great degree of inconvenience has been caused during the works. The students have been distracted from normal lessons due to the noise made by the workmen standing outside on the scaffolding. Besides, no ball games could be played in the playground and students had to turn to other sports grounds for their P.E. lessons. In a word, the work has been a nuisance to our school. However, it could have been indeed much worse. May we look forward to the new face of our school in the coming school year with appreciation.







Looking Back 15 Years

Brother Herman was the first Headmaster in 1969, since April 1970, Bro. Eugene has been our school Principal. In his more than 15 years' experience, we can have a brief look at the old and new CSK.

First of all, the quality of CSK boys, CSK, I dare to say, is among the best schools in Hong Kong. The students sent here are supposed to be good. Practically all are ranked band one in their primary studies. And so, the quality of students in CSK is quite good indeed. Our school is an Anglo-Chinese school, but the students' ability to use English is not so good. It may be because they didn't build up a good foundation in English in their primary schools, and so it is hard for them to catch up in the secondary. This is quite common in many schools. The results in the past public examinations like HKCEE, have been very good, for example in Mathematics, we had a passing percentage of over 90% last year.

Next, we come to the changes in the surroundings. Now in Sheung Wo Street, there are three schools. Do you know which was the first school building on the hill? I think you will know that our school was the first one established.

There used to be no estate, no schools when this school was built. Our school was the only building on the hill. However, as time went by, the area was highly developed with a large estate and two other schools on Sheung Wo Street. The place where our school is situated is a very good place for studying. Quiet, peace and no airport noise. Sometimes, a bit of a nuisance is caused by the neighbouring schools when they are doing their assembly in the morning or at recess. However, some of the nuisance is caused by our own students.

In the past 16 years, our fellow schoolmates has achieved considerable success in both academic and sports events. In public examinations, as in above, CSK boys have done quite well.

In sports events, our school teams have done quite well. We had been the overall champion in basketball and badminton for a number of years. Our results in inter-school athletics, football, cross-country have kept us playing in division I for a long time. So, in order to maintain the high standard, students and teachers in charge should co-operate fully. The results depend on the spirit of the students, their will to win, and on the teachers who are in charge.

Since our school has been established, we have improved steadily in both academic results and sports performance. And the basic task of us now is to keep up that high standard. From the point of view of other people, particularly the parents of students, CSK is recognised as a good school. It is indeed the result of the students' and teachers' co-operation, and contribution to the good foundation of CSK!










An Interview with Dr. Spencer Chan One of the old boys of Chan Sui Ki

Dr. Spencer Chan has been working as a dentist for five years. After he had studied a pre-dental course for two years and dental course for four years in the Philippines, he furthered his studies in the United States on the course of Daily Practice in Modern Dentistry. He got the degrees of 'Doctor of Dental Medicine' and 'Dental Surgeon'. After he graduated in 1980, he came back to Hong Kong to start his Practice here.

"Is your present job most suitable for you?"

"Whenever you want to study in a professional school, you should find out whether you have much interest in the profession you choose. I think I have made the right choice".

He told us that 'Dentistry' is related to Science and Art. Interest in applied Science and practical skills both play an important part, such as restorative and prosthodontic, dentistry demand a great deal of effort both in studying and in application.

"Did you have any practice on slivering on wax? What are some of the difficulties?"

"Yes, I had that practice. I feel that practice presents challenges. As practical skills are not included in the H.K. education curriculum, while faced with the challenge, you have to find your own solution. Fortunately, a scale was provided for me to follow and measure my progress. After having been trained step by step, I could gradually make the shape I wanted."

When asked about his secondary education, he said, "After graduating in Form 5, I went to New Method College to complete my Matriculation Course. Then I went to the Philippines to further my studies. I graduated in CSK in 1974."

"What class were you in, Arts or Science?"

"At that time, the school did not divide us into Arts and Science."

Before working as a dentist in Nathan Road, Dr. Chan had worked in Tsuen Wan Kai Fong Welfare Association, Teacher Association and his father's Clinic. (His father was also a dentist.) He has been working in Nathan Road for about three years.

"Did you want to become a dentist because your father was also a dentist?"

"It's true that he had some influence on me."

"Did anyone help you to start this clinic?"

"I borrowed money from the bank to start my clinic. This is a common practice among the doctors in H.K."

"It is a common belief that money is everything. What do you think about that?"

"It is a difficult question to answer. People equate success with money and reputation with wealth and riches. It's true that money is a necessity. However, I think that a sense of achievement is more important than the money you earn."

"What's your goal in life?"

"As a member of the dental professionals, my development in business is fixed. My goal is expansion on my dental services."

"Do you think that unless people receive a high education, they will not succeed in their own profession?"

"I don't think so. A high education and a well-respected job are both difficult to get. Education is a stepping stone. Without it, we cannot come to grips with opportunities easily. 'Make hay while the sun shines' so we must work hard."

"On the other hand, if you do not have the chance to receive a high education, and are taught well mainly by your own experiences, you can also get hold of the opportunities offered you. Some of my classmates have been working after they graduated in Form 5. One is a managing director of a factory now and some are successful businessmen. Where there is a will, there is a way.' In fact, 'All Roads lead to Rome.' and 'Practice makes perfect.' There are many ways for us to get high jobs if we work hard."

He further mentioned that it is different between school life and social life. He often enjoyed reminiscing about life in his teens because it was, without exception, a rebellious period and a period with fewer pressures.

"In my boyhood, it was a rebellious period against traditions. At that time, there were many youth problems. This widened my horizon and I could see the dark side of life. It helped me mature faster and become adapted to society earlier. My life in University also influenced me a lot."

"Did you feel bored during the time when you had to leave your home to study abroad?"

"I had that feeling during the first week but I began to find out the joy of being independent."

"After studying for so many years abroad, did you have any trying period?"

"Studying is a happy time. Of course, there were moments of ordeal. Generally speaking, after the ordeals were gone, you would feel happy again. Even the memory is sweet."

"Patience is bitter, but its fruit is sweet." We have to follow Spencer's example in his studies.

"What is the most memorable thing in your school life in CSK?"

"I was a member of the basketball school team. Once, we won the Inter-school basketball championship in Division I. I think that is worth remembering."

"Would you like to give some advice to CSK boys?"

"Everyone must tread the path of life alone. The sooner you start, the more chances you have. Tribulations and failures are sometimes inevitable. Do not despair. Come to grips with life itself and try hard. Success is sure to come."


















公益少丰團丰報 84-85





跆拳道會





動會的賽艇比賽。這使本會增添不少 光彩,更令我們感到鼓舞和興奮。



最後,希望獨木舟學會在未來能和各同學一樣——百尺竿頭,更進一步!給予同學更多機會享受海上遨遊的樂趣。




初時我覺得生活很寫意,因爲主人帶着 我一起走,經過很多地方,看見很多新奇事 物,而我又毫不費力。

做好自己的本份,守其责任而已。這是因為 經遇會考之後,我才發覺到做校隊的辛酸事。

在我唸中一時,看到那些師兄們穿上學 校的隊衣,早上、下午、放學時在球場上騁 馳着,好不威風,心中羡慕之感油然而生, 幻想着將來在球場上穿着球衣,在場上八面 威風, 傲视同羣的霸氣, 好不叫人神往; 於 是,我便開始接觸籃球運動。結果,在中三 那年,我終於能夠穿上校隊衣服,為我校爭 光,雖然那時並不是獨當一面的出色球員, 但已是十分的滿足,做到少時渴望做的事。 但舊年會考,把我對球隊的觀念徹底的打破 了。因為在收中六新生時,一點兒活動也不 理會,無論你是否校隊,只要你的成績有足夠的「分」,便可以進升中六,而那些只欠一分或兩分的校隊們,想藉以往對學校曾作出的一點兒貢獻而請求獲得中六學位,得來的只是一聲無奈的婉拒,可歎那些校隊們,只好負擔着昂貴的學費,在私校中升學。

雖然我十分幸運,能重返母校,升讀中 六,但回想多年校隊生涯,所得到的,只是 一份校队的光榮感,和勝利時别人的讚賞和 小小的獎牌,其他則一無所有,而付出的代 價,實在不少。除了練習時體力的消耗和練 習後疲勞的煎熬外,最重要的,還是時間上 的损失,每星期至少有雨天的時間,是用於 練習上,雖然你可以說,只要時間分配得當 ,自然是沒有問題的。但對於一些身負兩三 項甚至更多的校隊們,和一些不甚聰明的校 隊隊員而言,分配時間是十分困難的而校方 亦沒有替他們設想,減少他們代表學校的項 目,一星期五天,幾乎全是在練習中渡過, 試問這樣生活下的同學,怎能取得好成績呢 ?但在評選入讀中六的資格時,又不理會他 們的貢獻,甚至有些校隊們想留下他們的球 衣作為紀念,亦不允許,這樣怎不叫人心灰 , 失却從前對學校的热誠。

其實今年籃球隊成績的低落,在别人的眼裏,是因為今年球員在技術上的不濟,和那些舊有的好隊員都已離校之故,所以才影響成績。無可否認,這是其中的成因,但在我眼中,最主要的,還是球員們根本沒有比赛的熱誠。他們練習時散漫,比賽時缺乏戰意,對比賽只是草草了事,在這種情形下,無論你的技術多高明,亦只有一敗塗地。

有時亦很難怪他們的,正所謂「人不為己,天誅地滅」,他們為着將來在成績上的優異,再不想重走那些離校校際的舊路,以及對校隊的失望下,不惜以種種的藉口,減少練習的時間或在練習時故意偷工減料,不想為這全無結果和意義的練習上浪費太多氣

力。

但相反來看,球員們亦有不是之處;既 然你已成為校隊,便應為學校盡力,無論在 訓練時或比賽時都應全力以赴,反正時間已 是浪费定的,倒不如來個光榮及有意義的浪 費,比起以種種藉口,推却練習時間,和遊 戲比賽中來得光明磊落得多,而且受人讚賞 總比受人責備的好受。

過客,我凄凉的想,一個沒人關心的過 客。








新會陳冲陳瑞祺中學簡介

地點:中國廣東省新會縣羅坑區陳冲鄉

總建築面積:一萬二千多平方米

動工日期:一九八二年六月

開幕日期:一九八四年八月二十六日

建築費:港幣一仟多萬元

學額:一千八百名

新會陳冲陳瑞祺中學是繼陳瑞祺(喇沙) 書院及陳瑞祺(喇沙)小學創立後之另一所紀 念陳瑞祺新之學校。中國當局獲悉陳氏後人 興建中學之事,熱烈贊成,立即撥地給予興 建,並負責委派校長與教員,和擬訂課程等 事務。

新會陳冲陳瑞祺中學附設具有設備現代 化之教室、禮堂、實驗室、圖書館及食堂、 符合國際標準之游泳池、田徑場和室內運動 場、學生及教員宿舍等,而且,很多校內設 施的製造原料乃購自世界各國。例如課室黑 板乃來自澳洲、室內運動場之地板則來自加 拿大,規模之龐大,可媲美世界各地很多先 進國家之學校規格。

這所中學的一切建築物及教學設施,是 由陳瑞祺新哲嗣陳子民、陳經綸、陳經興先 生主持的陳瑞祺慈善紀念基金會捐助興建和 購置的。他們的祖父陳澄波新,早年在外園 經商,臨終前囑咐兒子陳瑞祺在家鄉興辦慈 善事業。陳瑞祺先生遵照其先新遺志,撥出 巨資成立陳瑞祺慈善紀念基金會,於一九三 ○年在家鄉陳冲鄉及山咀鄉獨資興建及自行經營澄波學校。陳瑞祺新逝世後,陳子民、陳經綸、陳經興兄弟東承先人志願,繼續在家鄉辨學。可惜在「十年動亂」中,該兩間學校都被迫改了名,陳氏祖屋更被拆掉。

中共十一屆三中全會後,僑務政策逐步落實。一九八一年,政府撥款人民幣叁萬餘元替陳家重建該租屋,陳氏兄弟對此重建事得到很大的欣慰。他們決定再出資人民幣十六萬元把這租屋建成一幢三層三合土樓房,免费借給澄波學校用為教師宿舍。一九八三年,營費任給澄波學校用為教師宿舍。一九八三年,同時再撥出巨資(一)用三合土建好陳冲墟大馬路。(二)建好陳冲鄉自來水設備與工程和一九八三年擴建兩所澄波小學。(三)最近將興建羅坑區衛生院及配備各設備。(四)於一九八三年捐助新會縣人民醫院港幣式拾伍萬元。這些設施都是陳氏兄弟為國家鄉里宗族所作出貢獻的一斑。







常和街聯校中文週

三所學校中文學會主席

接受訪問講感受

「常和街聯校中文週」乃有史以來第一次由常和街三 所學校聯合舉辦的活動,它的效果與成績,也許影響到以 後三所學校之間的關係。本刊編輯就此特地與三所學校之 中文學會主席——華英中學的梁芍紅、丘佐榮中學的關展 猷、及我校的劉偉强同學,做了一個簡短的訪問,他們認 爲.....

問:你們舉辦此次活動是抱着甚麼宗旨?

關:最主要的當然是爲了傳播中國文化。由 於三所學校都以英文爲教學語言,所以 ,我們希望藉着舉辦[中文週],喚起同 學對中文的興趣及重視。

問:除此之外,就個别而言,你們舉辦此次 活動可有其他目的?

梁:爲了文化交流與促進學校之間的友誼。

關:此乃一項既新奇又具突破性的嘗試,而 且迄今我會在此學年內並未在校內舉辦 任何代表性的活動。

劉:一直以來中文學會所舉辦的活動,是以 大型班際性居多,至於其他常規性活動 如作文、書法比賽等,同學反應則不大 好,且有每況愈下之感,所以希望藉此 機會,激起校内同學對這方面的興趣。

問:在籌劃和進行期間,你們在各方面遇到 甚麼大的困難和問題?

梁:是經濟問題。因為舉辦此類活動所需的 資金頗大,而學會經濟能力則有限,況 且本身校内仍要舉辦其他活動,亦需要 金錢。

關:真正做事的時間很短,人手亦不足,做事 的同學大部份未能完全投入工作之中。

劉:時間分配是進行期間一個很大的問題,

由於三校放學時間不一,所有活動便需等待到三所學校放學後,才能正式開始,此等安排,對整體來說影響頗大。

問:同學們對「中文週」的反應如何?而你 們認為「中文週」得到的效果怎樣?與 你們起初所要求的有否很大的差别?

梁:同學們的反應一般如是;效果則不過不 失。

關:同學們的反應不顯得十分熱烈,可能是 因為宣傳時間不足所致;效果與起初所 想的沒有突破性的差别。

劉:反應不算太差,但與理想仍有很大距離。

問:你們認為此類活動是否值得鼓勵?

梁:值得鼓勵。

關:是否值得鼓勵仍在商權之中。問題是在 於舉辦此類聯校活動會遇到很多困難, 因為基本上三所學校的制度、作風截然 不同,以致學校之間的合作不甚調和。 而另一方面,舉辦此類活動,對籌委會 會員的意義,往往大於對其他同學的意 義,這種情形與宗旨有所差異。

劉:是值得鼓勵的。然而,要舉辦此類極具 挑戰性的活動,還要視乎以後學會新的 委員的作風和意願,加上「機緣」是否 巧合而言。





學校際田徑賽第一組陳瑞祺書院吳國雄



最後,他藉此機會多謝Mr. O'Brien、 邱老師、袁老師和其他同學對他的支持和鼓 勵。


