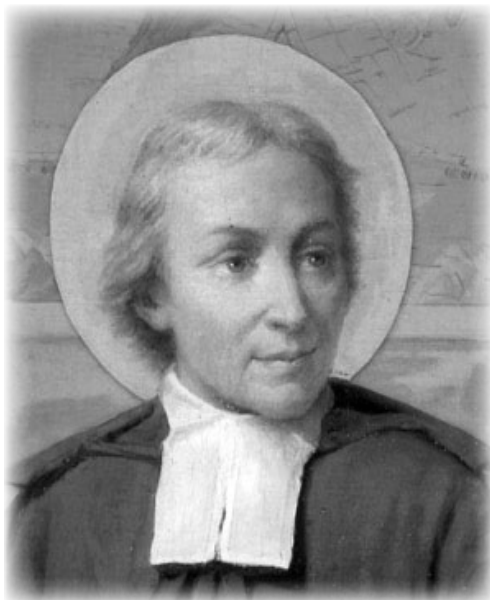

Message of Pope Francis for the 29th World Youth Day 2014

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:3)



This year we will begin by reflecting on the first Beatitude: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:3).

In proclaiming the Beatitudes, **Jesus asks us to follow him and to travel with him along the path of love, the path that alone leads to eternal life.** It is not an easy journey, yet the Lord promises us his grace and he never abandons us.

What does it mean to be "blessed" (makarioi in Greek)? **To be blessed means to be happy.** Tell me: Do you really want to be happy? In an age when we are constantly being enticed by vain and empty illusions of happiness, we risk settling for less and "thinking small" when it comes to the meaning of life. Think big instead! Open your hearts!

Let us try to understand what it means to be "poor in spirit". **When the Son of God became man, he chose the path of poverty and self-emptying.** As Saint Paul said in his letter to the Philippians: "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in human likeness" (2:5-7). Jesus is God who strips himself of his glory. **Here we see God's choice to be poor: he was rich and yet he became poor in order to enrich us through his poverty (cf. 2 Cor 8:9).**

You might ask me, then: What can we do, specifically, to make poverty in spirit a way of life, a real part of our own lives? ...if we are to live by this Beatitude, **all of us need to experience a conversion in the way we see the poor.** We have to care for them and be sensitive to their spiritual and material needs.

To you young people I especially entrust the task of restoring solidarity to the heart of human culture. ... We have to remember all those who feel unloved, who have no hope for the future and who have given up on life out of discouragement, disappointment or fear. We have to learn to be on the side of the poor, and not just indulge in rhetoric about the poor! **Let us go out to meet them, look into their eyes and listen to them. The poor provide us with a concrete opportunity to encounter Christ himself, and to touch his suffering flesh.**

Supervisor's Message

Whilst the school was busy preparing admission of Form One students last summer, it was also working hard to ensure a smooth transition from the School Management Committee to the Incorporated Management Committee mode of governance. In short, the Incorporated Management Committee has the ultimate responsibility for its conduct and budget, and is a separate legal entity by itself. In the past, ultimate responsibility of the school rested with the La Salle Brothers. The authority to manage the school is now vested in the IMC but the La Salle Brothers still plays a prominent role in the IMC, ensuring that the school is run according to the Lasallian value and teaching philosophy. Representation from teaching staff, parents, and Old Boys are properly elected among their constituent members, and an independent school manager was appointed by the IMC. A balanced composition of members ensures that different opinions and perspectives are heard in the meeting.



Stepping into the third year of DSE, our school continues to perform well in the public examination, though there are still areas that need improvement. Teachers are identifying areas which require more attention so that our students will get a better chance to qualify for university admission. Our Old Boys have been helping our higher form students to prepare for their tertiary education for some years already. Recently more Old Boys are coming back to support our students in the area of improving self-awareness and offer some introduction to legal concept. With vast resources from our Old Boys and parents, the school is determined to provide necessary assistance for our students.

Over the past few years, in addition to the local Christian Brothers Schools Exchange Program, we have been receiving exchange students from overseas as our student for one academic year. Those students from overseas blended into the school and with our local students over time, and have established a strong tie with them. Our students are able to experience different culture at an early stage thanks to such an arrangement.

Typhoon Haiyin, one of the strongest tropical cyclones ever recorded on earth, or Yolanda as the Filipinos called it, swept the Philippines last November, causing thousands of casualties and making numerous homeless. The Lasallian East

Asia District (LEAD), and the UMAEL (World Union for Former Lasallian Students) of which our OBA is a member, jointly pledged for relief from other communities. Hong Kong promptly joined in and CSK showed our support by donating a decent amount of relief fund to help those who suffered in the catastrophe.

This is the first year that the Hong Kong Lasallian Family launched a full-scale fund-raising raffle ticket sale. The proceeds will go to the Hong Kong Lasallian Mission Fund which provides resources for programs and activities of the La Salle Brothers.

In the sports arena, after a frustrating loss in Wanchai Sportsground earlier this year, we need to keep our spirit up in order to regain our status in the first division next year. Every athlete has made his effort and contributed his part to the overall result, and should bear no regret.

Lastly, I would like to thank all in the editing team and the teacher advisors who put so much effort into making this magazine so interesting to read.

In particular, we owe our thanks to the school prefects and the members of the Hong Kong Lasallian Youth Movement.

A number of officials from different sections of the Education Bureau visited CSK in the second semester. We got the review of the Refined English Enhancement Scheme, the focus inspection on Music and Visual Arts, and visits paid by the Curriculum Development Officers of Chinese Language Education and Technology Education. All these are good opportunities for professional sharing on curriculum and pedagogy. Through these dialogues and sharing, our teachers have gained much insight and inspiration for everyday teaching, curriculum planning as well as professional development.



This year marks the 44th year of CSK. It is high time for review of experiences, consolidation of wisdom and preparation for the 45th Anniversary in the coming year. While we busy ourselves with the celebration events, let us hold fast to our Lord Jesus and ask for His grace and guidance so that we may go forward with faith and courage.

Last but not least, my appreciation and thanks to Mr. HT Tang and other members of the Editorial Board who contribute considerable time and effort to the work of the School Magazine. The magazine is always a record of CSK life. In years to come, you will all look back on your life here and smile at the memories.

Speech Day 2013

Speech by Prof. Joseph J.Y. Sung, Vice Chancellor and President of the Chinese University of Hong Kong

Brother Patrick, Mr. Lau, Mr. Lee, Mr. Chan, two councils, teachers, parents, ladies and gentlemen.

It is a great honour for me to join your Speech Day today, but I have been attending many speech days. I know nobody actually wait for the speech, you just wait for the speech to be finished. So I would make it short and give you more time to celebrate with your parents and with your family. Before I deliver my speech, I would like to ask all the graduates to stand up from your seats, because today is not just a day for celebration. Today is a day for gratitude. Today is a day to give thanks to your parents, to your families. So I ask you to turn 90 degree anticlockwise, facing your family and give them a big round of applause, please.

Now you can face to the stage because I was told that your teachers and your councils are sitting in front of you, so I will ask you to give your teachers, your principal, Brother Patrick and all the school councils a big round of applause thanking them. Please be seated.

Actually today is a very special day for me because I don't think I have ever shaken so many hands before in my life. This is my second speech day of today, so I have shaken hundreds of hands, and some are sweating. And I tell you a secret, in the university, in our congregations, I don't actually shake hands with university graduates. They don't even have time to come up to the stage because we have about 3,500 graduates at the congregation every year. So what they can do is just to stand up from their seats and when the Council Chairman or the Chief Executive, who is the chancellor of the



university, announce that they have been granted this degree, they will wear their hats and they will cheer and that's all. So they don't even get the chance to shake hands when they graduate. But I will take this opportunity to congratulate you and at the same time point out to you one really worrying phenomenon in Hong Kong.

I am sure you have heard about in recent years or even months, a lot of arguments about whether or not Hong Kong should receive more foreign students into our school system, especially into the university. There is a fear that overseas students and graduates will sooner or later take away opportunities of education in Hong Kong, scholarships at the university, or even jobs for our young men and women. We should, therefore, restrict the number of foreign students. We should limit immigration and we should protect our own local interests. What is your view on this?

Well, first and foremost, I think you would agree with me that with the advent of internet, cloud computing, a lot of social media and the ease of international traveling, the independence of global economy, the trend of internationalization is inevitable. In fact, all the major issues that we are concerning today are global issues. Is climate change and energy shortage a global issue? Is financial crisis which started at the Wall Street of New York a few years ago and then spread to Europe and finally landed in Asia a global issue? This year, 2013, marks the tenth year after SARS and we are now still



under the threat of a new SARS coronavirus in the Middle East which was then spread to the UK and to the Netherlands. Even diseases are global issues. So I would say that globalization is a trend that cannot be reverted because technology that makes globalization inevitable cannot be uninvented. Better and cheaper transportation and communication will only further advance the forces of globalization.

So for those of you who are graduating and open a new page in your life today, you will be either studying in local university or you go abroad. I am afraid that you cannot simply close your eyes and shut your ears or build fences around yourself to alienate yourself and Hong Kong from the rest of the world. To succeed, Hong Kong must remain to be a cosmopolitan city, be able to attract, and retain and absorb talents from all over the world. To succeed, we must train our local students to prepare themselves to be able to meet the need of the world. We want our students to be mobile, to be able to find their niche anywhere in the world. Boys, I hold that you will get prepared yourselves in a few years' time when Airbus, the largest air carrier in the world, wants to have top-notch engineers, they can hire you to work in Hamburg, Germany. I hope that if Google or Apple in the United States wants to have the best computer science, they would find you to work in the U.S for better Ipods and better Ipads for the future. In Africa when AIDS or other infectious disease outbreak cannot be controlled, I hope they can call upon you to work in this country to control the deadly infectious disease in global help. You may be working in Geneva with the United Nations, UNESCO or World Bank for global crisis like earthquakes, tsunami or other financial disasters.

In fact, if it is not because of internationalization, today I look at Brother Patrick here, we could not have servants of God coming from the other side of the globe, spending their whole life educating young men in Hong Kong and benefit our local students here. So I would say that internationalization and globalization should go on and let us keep ourselves competitive and have a global vision. Having said that, staying global and staying competitive, ladies and gentlemen, does not necessarily mean that you have to give up your tradition, your culture or your identity. We should learn better, to understand global issues, and problems of other jurisdictions, and at the same time you should understand your culture and

your tradition better. You should recognize diversity but respect cultural differences and maintain our tradition, morality and core values. So I actually regret that I dropped Chinese History in Form 4. I hope you will continue to know more about our own nation, our philosophy, our history, and our culture. I hope you will continue to celebrate, wherever you are, the Mooncake Festival. You will still give 'lai see' to your young kids in the future wherever you go. And you will enjoy Chinese tea, calligraphy and Chinese music wherever you grow your family in the future. I hope we will learn how to respect differences and cultural diversity.

So to all the young graduates here today, may I suggest you to open your heart, widen your horizon, broaden your knowledge. You never know where you end up with, but you'd better prepare yourself to work in some other parts of the world. And make yourself useful wherever you go. There was a survey about two years ago on a thousand local students and the survey said 78% of our local graduates are not willing to leave Hong Kong to find their job and their future career. And if you ask them why they are not willing to go, the three main reasons are: they are not confident that the places they are going to will give them the same comfort and security. The second reason is they think the family cooking is better than their own cooking or restaurants outside. And the third is that they don't know very much about other parts of the world, including mainland China. So if you forget everything that I said today, please keep your mind open, stay competitive and learn more about the world including our mother nation, China.

My best wishes for all of you and I hope to see some of you at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Thank you.



HKDSE Results 2013

165 students sat for the HKDSE Examination 2013. Overall results of our students attaining between “level 2+” and “level 5+” were all better than those of the territory. Percentages of “level 3+” in all four core subjects and six electives were higher than the territory figures and percentages of “level 5+” in seven subjects were higher than the territory ones. 46.1% of our students (as compared with 34.9% in the territory) fulfilled the entrance requirements for university programmes, i.e. core subjects at 3322 or better. 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Speech Day 2014

Speech by Prof. Way Kuo, President and University Distinguished Professor of City University of Hong Kong

Good evening, Brother Patrick. Mr. Chan, Mr. Lau and Principal Lee, teachers, students, parents and ladies and gentlemen. Thank you for inviting me for this very significant occasion. I am honored to be here and delighted to have the opportunity to address such a talented crowd of hardworking students. I understand this is a boys' school, all boys. I graduated from a boys' school, too, but that was in 1968. I heard this school was founded in 1969.

In the past so many years, things have changed quite a bit. In 1968, 1969, there was no air conditioning. There was no colour TV. Of course, there was no camcorder. Certainly, there was no cell phone. And you may not know that, in 1968, 1969, the instant noodle was not even invented. And I notice that, this generation, you are much taller than my generation. In my generation, I was the top 20% in terms of height. But today, I notice that I am average person among you. I also notice that, all boys, in 1968 many of your parents were not born yet. And I look at our Brother here today. In my generation, a person like Brother, who has been in Hong Kong for half a century, would be considered as an aged person. But today you are a young boy. And I'd tell you that, in 1968 it was much difficult to cook Cantonese food. You like steam fish, right? I can tell you that, it is much easier to cook steam fish today, because you can control the fire much better and you can keep the fire at constant temperature, so that makes the steam fish cooking far more easier than the previous one. So life has changed quite a bit.

Brother told me that, today you learn French, you learn Spanish, and you have chance to learn Japanese. In my generation, all these are very very foreign languages. I understand that



in 1968, the teachers looked at the students. The students listened to the teachers, right? Today, the teachers listen to the students. In 1968, boys invited girls to go to the movies. But today is the other way around. To show you that things really changed quite a bit. But what does not change? Not everything changed actually. We love our family that does not change. The way we enjoy soccer games does not change. So our life actually moves on. All these backgrounds to share with you is what I want to say that today we are paying attention to innovation. What is education today different from the education that received many years ago? Since I came to City University of Hong Kong as the President, we are promoting a discovery-enriched curriculum. By that we mean that all students in your four years' college in CityU, you have to have some innovation. It can be

very small. It can be very small in terms of cooking. It can be very small about energy. It can be something very little improvement about the environmental protection, how to treat your colleagues well. These are the things that make us very unique. And this is the reason why today it sounds a miracle City University of Hong Kong, the engineering programme we are ranking number 1 in China, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Macau. We are number 1. We are not number 2. It is not because we have any miracle to share with you. It is because we understand our life has to move on. We know what changed and what doesn't change. We know that in our education system, we have to constantly look at what are the ways to benefit our society quite a bit.

In fact, for those who are here, who are graduating from the school, your expect life is 120 years. That is why I said Brother you are a young boy. Because you all live longer, actually, you enjoy your life much better. We hope that you can contribute to our society through such an educational system at City University of Hong Kong where we send our students to international places. Do you know what we mean by international standard? Today we are promoting international standard, internationalization. I'd tell you that, language is not the most important thing. Language is important but not the most important thing. As you can tell, the English language we are speaking today is more American English. Of course Hong Kong is different, people speak

British English. 50 years ago, the mother English was German English, was German accent. 100 years ago you would be first class if you speak French English. And 25 years ago, if you speak English with Japanese accent, that must be very good. And I can tell you, in 20 years, the Chinese English will be the mother English. And in 50 years, maybe English is the international language. All I am saying is, language is not the most important, international standard is the most important thing.

How do we practice as international standard? One of the most important international standard is what I'd like to conclude is the innovation in our life. What we can do, even just very little, to contribute to our society through innovation, through independent thinking. We are not only challenging others, we need to learn how to challenge ourselves. It is not easy to challenge yourself. The society moves on because we all challenge ourselves in terms of enjoyment entertainments, learning experiences and I know in Hong Kong I would like to know cooking. I enjoy cooking. Cooking is not that easy, but cooking style changes every day because of innovation.

At the end, I appreciate to be here and I thank you for giving me the opportunity to speak to all the boys and the parents and everyone here. I wish you all the best. I know, your generation is definitely better than my generation. Thank you.

HKDSE Results 2014

170 students sat for the HKDSE Examination 2014. Overall results of our students attaining between “level 2+” and “level 4+” were all better than those of the territory e.g. Level 3 or above 71.2% (HK 59.4%), Level 4 or above 37.1% (HK 33.2%). Percentages of “level 3+” in all four core subjects and six electives were higher than the territory figures.

53.5% of our students (HK 35.6%) fulfilled the entrance requirements for university programmes, i.e. core subjects at 3322 or better. 42.9% of our students (HK 27.1%) attained 332233 or better (core subjects at 3322 or better, with two electives at level 3 or better).

Formation throughout the year Catechism Class

(Every Tuesday and Thursday)

Every Tuesday, we have our catechism class B, the second class that began in September 2013. We have moved to have lessons outside PE office, a place of more convenience and hence more relaxed discussion may follow. Through the discussion, queries and good answers explained by the Church are shared in a joyous manner, which always inspire them to the height of reason and faith, both of which find the truth in the loving heart of God.

Catholic Gathering

(Once a month)

By themes and with games, with prayerful settings and hymns, we prepared different events each month to live a little community life distinctive of its fraternity nurtured by the love of Christ. We played group games, shared our lunches together, prayed with Taize hymns in chapel, and prayed the Way of the Cross together.



Journey of Faith, from September on Opening Mass (2nd September, 2013)

At the commencement of a new academic year, our school was blessed by the Opening Mass celebrated by Rev. Father Matthew Chan, SDB. Junior and senior form students, together with their masters and mistresses, prayed with curious attentiveness, and experienced to some of them their first Holy Mass in their lives.



Holy Mass (4th Oct, 8th Nov, & 6th Dec, 2013; 3rd Jan, 14th Feb, 14th Mar, 4th Apr, & 2nd May, 2014)

Following the good history of last year, we have organized celebrations of Holy Mass on different special occasions for our school. From October to May, once a month we invited priests to celebrate the Holy Mass in devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, important saints of the Church (e.g. SS. Cyril and Methodius), and fitting time for the year as in Lent and in Eastertide. There was a requiem mass celebrated in November for the departed Brothers, teachers, workers and students of CSK.

Pilgrimage (9th November, 2013)

Our pilgrimage to the Trappist Haven Monastery has come to its second year. It was such a precious chance for twenty one students, accompanied by two teachers, to meet the priests on an autumn Saturday. Rev. Father Chong arranged a section with us, introducing their wondrous and gracious history. He also offered to perform small magic tricks to help us know

the importance of prayer. Our young pilgrims, with both Catholics and non-Catholics, enjoyed the visit greatly. The encounter with prayerful brothers, cloistered to pray for the whole world all their lives, was once again truly eye-opening.



Katso Camp (23rd – 24th November, 2013)

With other secondary schools, our school sent four boys to join a camp that forms Catholic leaders at school. Our students had a great time before and after the camp in the formation sections, and enjoyed the games and prayerfully reflective atmosphere in the camp.

Christmas Service and Easter Service (20th December, 2013 & 17th April, 2014)

It was with hymns and prayers, with songs and cheers, that our school called for its Christmas celebration of 2013. The Catholic Society and the Music Club jointly organized a Christmas prayer service and a Christmas concert in the school hall on 20th December. We prayed in the presence of God together, for both teachers and students. We remembered the manger far away but close to our hearts where Jesus the newborn King is to be born. In a moment of reflection, we prayed together for peace in Syria, especially for the persecuted Christians who were unable to celebrate Christmas this year. At the Christmas concert, there were lucky draws and performances of students and teachers, including games, singing and rock band performances. As a tradition of our students, graduating classes took the opportunity to thank teachers for their hard work and dedication. It was a day of thanksgiving and exultation.

At a more important festival, the Easter of Resurrected Jesus, as the whole Church celebrated Easter in the Holy Week, and we took the opportunity to celebrate Easter with a prayer service. We began our prayers with a hymn “Whatsoever you do”, which enlightened the theme of this service – “When I was homeless, you opened the door”. We listened to the Word of God, on which we meditated on the Last Supper of Jesus and His loved ones, where Jesus instituted the Eucharist and shared His Body and Blood with us. From a video on Blessed Mother Teresa’s life, we witnessed how this saintly nun offered her life and called many more women into the humble service for the poorest of the poor. At the end of the prayer service, we prayed for each other’s families and ourselves in the prayer Mother Teresa used to pray every day. We wish all of you an Easter of hope, a hope that all of us are given, the hope of heaven after this life.



Easter Retreat (24th – 25th April, 2014)

We felt grateful that Fr. Timothy Wan, a young and youthful priest newly ordained in that same week, joined us at Salesian Retreat House, Cheung Chau for our annual retreat as our retreat Master. The retreat features its seclusion in the contemplation of the following theme: “What is a prayer?”



Eight students participated with fervor in praying and learning to pray for two days and 1 night away from businesses. Our students found the retreat a real time for the presence of God, in front of the Eucharist and inside their hearts, and saw a real change in their prayers.

Holy Mass (Feast of St. John Baptist de La Salle) (8th May, 2014)

After quite a while, our school hall was once again filled with the scent of the Holy Mass. On this important feast day, as we celebrated a little earlier than the worldwide Lasallians who celebrate it in mid-May, we gathered at the table of the Lord. Rev. Fr. Matthew Chan, SDB, gave us an important reminder of this great saint, our elder Brother. Teachers were no less enthusiastic to participate in the Mass. We were all delighted to receive the Bread of Life together, in the small family of CSK, and in communion with the Church.

Other pastoral work and formation Invitation slips and posters to students

Students receive invitation slips on occasions of Holy Masses and formation activities. The effect was tremendous, and students find the slips a truly personal welcome. Posters are also designed and posted all through the year for students to consider coming to the functions and learn the faith and catechism any week they feel ready and curious about them.

Morning Prayer, Prayer after Recess, and Prayer after Lunch

In our school, the prayers three times a day, a good tradition of the Lasallian education, are faithfully kept. In particular the morning prayer, a chance for principal, teachers and students to take turns to lead the prayer for the school, the school altogether gives thanks to God and asks for His blessings.

Groups and Societies

Lasallian Youth Movement

In the Lasallian Youth Movement of this year, we enjoyed the active participation in areas such as fund-raising for the urgent relief of the Lasallian family in the Philippines, Dress Casual Day fund-raising, and the Lasallian Exchange Programme of Christian Brothers' Schools. With our focus narrowing and yet extending further in the Lasallian vision, our students found a closer bond with this family and more awareness of those in need in society who need even today great followers of La Salle.



Catholic Society

The Catholic Society recruits students of every background to live as a community of integrity supported by the faith of the Roman Catholic Church. With Catholics and non-Catholics, this year was a strong foundation for all the members. They benefited both in knowledge and faith through the work of both teachers and students by the guidance of the Holy Spirit.



Speak English Days

In order to arouse students' interest in learning English, boost their confidence in using English and create an English-rich environment, the English Language Society have organized the Speak English Days.

This year, the three Speak English Days were held on 21st and 22nd November 2013, 26th and 27th February 2014, and 15th and 16th May 2014.

On the first Speak English Day, students dedicated songs and played a game called "Spot the difference". There were a choice of thirty songs for students and they could dedicate the songs that they liked to their classmates or teachers. These activities enabled students to practise speaking English outside the classroom and have fun while playing the game.

On the second Speak English Day, students formed groups to play Scrabble, a game that could help them to increase their vocabulary.

On the third Speak English Day, there was a game in which students had to match some national flags to the right countries.

CBS Exchange Programme

The CBS (Christian Brothers' Schools) Exchange Program 2014 was successfully held from 6th April, 2014 to 11th April, 2014.

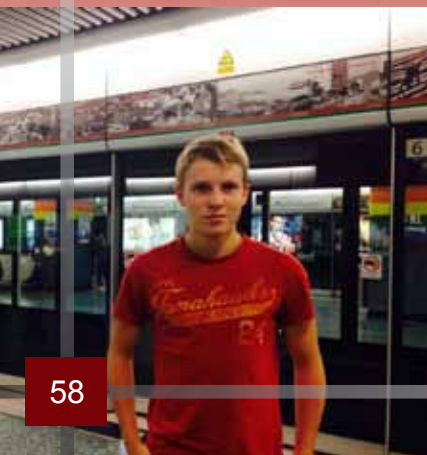

Sports Report 2013-2014

Just like last year, we also had a very tight inter-class sports competition schedule in September this year. It was most probably the first time that our Inter-class Athletics Meet commenced before our Inter-class Swimming Gala. The first day of our Inter-class Athletics Meet was held on 19th September 2013. Our students had to submit their entries for the competition within one week. Fortunately, we could organize our Athletics Meet at Wanchai Sports Ground again this year.

Our Inter-class Swimming Gala was held just one week after the first day of our Athletics Meet. It was held on 27th September 2013 at Tai Wan Shan Swimming Pool. Most of the winners could achieve inter-school standards in different events. La Salle College won the 4 x 50 m Invitation Relay and set a new record of 1:44.56, which was the only record broken on that day. Mr. Michael O'Brien, our former PE Department Head, was the Guest of Honour this year and he presented the prizes to the winners.

For the Inter-school Swimming Championships held in October 2013, many of our team members achieved standards. Although many of them were also qualified for the finals, only a few boys could obtain medals. Our C Grade team member Mok Ho Tung (2C) did particularly well and took two gold medals in the 200 m Freestyle and 200 m Individual Medley. He also helped our 4 x 50 m Medley Relay Team to take the Champion title in the event. On the whole, our C Grade team members did comparatively better and placed our C Grade Team in the 4th position.

The second day of our Inter-class Athletics Meet was held on 23rd October 2013. Mr. Wong Yan Kit Hase was our Guest of Honour this year. Not many team members could achieve inter-school standards. Our B Grade team member Li Ka Ho (4E) did extremely well in Javelin and set a new record of 47.52 m, which was further than the old record by more than 13 metres. Li Ka Ho continued to perform well in the Inter-school Athletics Championships which was held in February 2014. Although we were competing in Division One this year, Li Ka Ho further improved his record to 49.43 m and eventually took the Champion title of the B Grade Javelin throw. His friend Ngan Tsz Cheung (6D) also made excellent achievements this year. He came 3rd in A Grade Discus and was Champion in A Grade Shot Put, proving that he was also one of the best among the Division One winners. His A Grade Shot Put result of 14.79 m had also become the HKSSF Inter-school Boys A Grade (Under 19) record. Unfortunately, the overall results were not good enough to help us stay in Division One. We had to be relegated to Division Two again by missing just 3 points.

The Performance of our Cross Country Team was also disappointing this year. We were 14th (out of 16 schools) Overall and we were nearly relegated to Division Two. The only encouraging result was attained by Tristan Richter, our exchange student from Germany, who was 12th in the A Grade race. Tristan also improved his performance in 5000 m achieved in October by more than one minute and took the 3rd place in the A Grade 5000 m race in the SCAA Inter-school Athletics Meet

held in December 2013. He also obtained a standard point for our school in the same event in the Inter-school Athletics (Division One) Championships.

Our Football Team was not lucky either. Our B Grade Team was qualified for the Final Round but lost 1(4):1(5) to SJAC and could not proceed any further for better positions. On the other hand, although our A- and B-Grade Basketball Teams were not qualified for the Final Round, our C Grade team did very well all the way and eventually took the 2nd place in the Team position.

Comparatively, our results in the racket games were more encouraging this year. Our B Grade Badminton Team was 4th in the Inter-school Badminton (Division One) Competition. Our A Grade Team players Tang Ho Hin (4A) and Pong Lap Yan (A) were Champion and 3rd respectively in the HK Schools Jing Ying Badminton Individual Tournament this year. Our Badminton Team was also 3rd in the Secondary Boys Open Section of the Bank of China HK Inter-school Badminton Team Championships 2014.

For the Table-tennis Team, our B Grade Team was Champion in the Inter-school Table-tennis (Division Two) Competition this year. The C Grade team also entered the Final Round although our team could not get into the first four positions in the end. With the combined results of the A-, B-, and C- Grade teams, we were 3rd Overall. However, we still needed two more points in order to be promoted to Division One.

On the whole, the inter-school sports results were still satisfactory this year. However, we have slipped from 9th to 14th in the Boys Section of the BOCHK Bauhinia Bowls Award 2013-2014. The influence of the HKDSE Exam has become more obvious as reflected by the attendance rate of our team training and the results of the competitions. Undoubtedly, HKDSE is the primary concern for most of our students. However, the proper management of time, and priorities in daily affairs, it is still possible to strike a balance between studying and participation in sports training. Ngan Tsz Cheung (6D) and Li Ka Ho (4E) are role models who spend five or more days per week in sports training and still obtain good academic results.

There is no easy way leading to success no matter for studies or sports. It always takes a lot of determination and hard work to achieve outstanding performances. 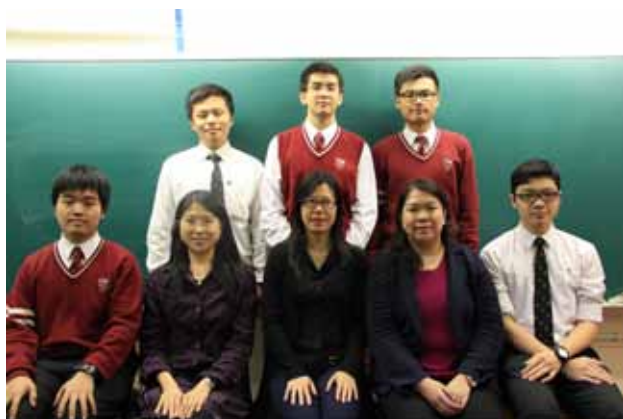

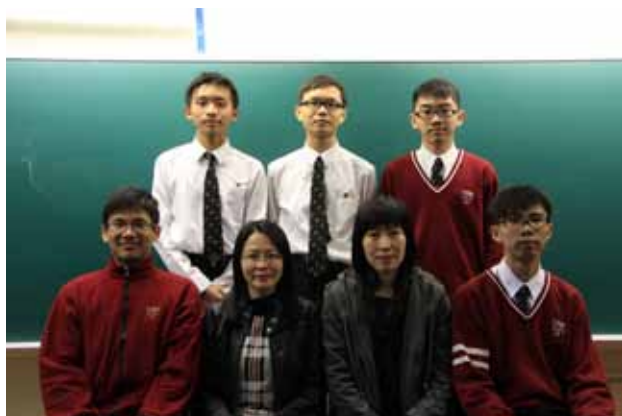

Old Boys' Association

Message from President of Old Boys' Association

The CSKOBA is run by a group of Old Boys volunteering to contribute to the alumni community and our Alma Mater. At the start of this school year, I was honoured to have been elected president. Thanks to the support from the school, teachers, students, parents and the other Old Boys, our programmes have received overwhelming response. It will be a long list if I talk about all the events held and yet, certain areas that we have emphasized during the year are worth highlighting.

Supporting Our Students

Our students' academic achievements are always a concern for Old Boys. Competition among schools has turned keener over the years. However, CSK has a longer and brighter history than many neighbouring schools. As a result, we have a stronger alumni community which is an advantage when helping our students. This year, the OBA has added new student support projects and has strengthened the work that has been done over the past few years.

Graduation brings uncertainty and sometimes anxiety. We want our students to feel accompanied when they are moving towards graduation. The Old Boys who have gone through the same challenges offer their selfless help to raise the confidence and competitiveness of our new graduates. Tailor-made for Form 6 students, the Old Boys Mentorship Programme has been conducted for the fifth year. Recently-graduated "young Old Boys" took up the role as mentors. They use their invaluable experience to coach our soon-to-be graduates on everything concerning examinations and further studies. Orchestrated programmes included subject-by-subject DSE preparation tips, introduction to university courses and procedures and requirements for admission. Our mentors also designed mock university interviews from genuine experiences and conducted a mock DSE result release day based on simulated grades of each participating student.

The Student Development Programme is a new programme targeting at CSK boys whose academic performance is less satisfactory. An OBA exco-member, Dr Stephen Li, who is a senior lecturer and programme co-ordinator at City University, partners with two other distinguished old boys – a former Legislative Councilor, Mak Kwok Fung and a lecturer at the Open University, Kevin Chu – to form a three-man team. Teachers recommend to the team suitable Form 3 and 4 students. Through serial talks in small groups and one-to-one communication, the three Big Brothers share personal experience in life to inspire them. Our aims are to restore their positive attitude towards life and to help them to get things back on track, especially to renew their interest in studying. Participating students have given positive feedback to this innovative form of assistance.

Apart from the projects directly run by the OBA Exco, other enthusiastic Old Boys also offer their specialties to help our students. In collaboration with the school, several new programmes have been launched. The "Law and Society" course taught by an alumnus, Magistrate To Ho Shing, aims at preparing future legal professionals and training in English. Responding to the need to raise students' interest in Chinese, a famous Old Boy writer, Anthony Wong, conducted a series of seminars on reading and writing for lower form students.

Linking Alumni to School

As the school adopts the "Incorporated Management Committee" system, the year 2013/2014 has marked a new page in the alumni participation in school management. In October, the OBA held a historic referendum election to select the Old Boy representative to the IMC. It was not only the first time for us. We were also the first Lasallian alumni body to hold an election for such a purpose.

The identity of "Chan Sui Ki Old Boy" is

life-long. It is natural for us to care about the reputation of our Alma Mater and to help with her development. In the last couple of years, such issues as 'national education' and 'direct subsidy scheme' have made alumni of many schools voice their opinions. Schools and the public have paid growing attention to the voices of alumni. The OBA is determined to link Old Boys to the school and to ensure that the channel for two-way communications is open.

This year, the OBA has made bigger use of the social media for communication. The effect is significant. Subscription to our Facebook fan page has rocketed by 140% since September. The total audience reached by our posts is 13 times more than the figure for the previous year. Old boys are kept up-to-date with school and alumni news while feedback is collected and channeled to the school.

Bringing Everyone Together

The OBA has brought together different members of the CSK family. On December 6, we saw football being the common language for different generations of CSK boys and teachers. The Old Boy football team came back to school

to challenge the staff team and an A/B-grade school team. Besides scoring goals, the three teams showed us unity and sportsmanship. Over 150 students, teachers and Old Boys enjoyed an afternoon of excitement.

The OBA joined hands with the Parent-Teacher Association to organize a Christmas barbecue party and a spring outing. No matter it is a festive evening in the covered playground or a day-tour in the northern New Territories, the principal, teachers, school managers, students, parents and alumni gathered as one family, enjoying wonderful fellowship and togetherness.

Our school will turn 45 years old in the academic year 2014/15. It is a good time to celebrate our past and present as we leap into the future. 以上是近體詩中的七言律詩。律詩的格律嚴謹，字數、平仄、用韻、對仗四方面各有規則，例如頷聯（第三、四句）以及頸聯（第五、六句）必須對仗工整，而第一、二、四、六、八句要句末押韻：言、恩、存、翻、原五字既是平聲亦是同韻（ㄛ），查證押韻與否必先查閱韻典，謹記同音字並不一定押韻。

中國文化源遠流長，中文如欲取得進步則必先下苦工，語文能力不進則退。希望各位師弟細心解讀詩歌內容，從中明白應考公開試並不是一人之私，而是眾人之公，共勉之！

書同文，現在普通話已普及，語同音已是大勢所趨，將來語音將會統一，一概叫普通話，爭論用什麼語系來定每字的平、仄，甚至用不用平仄來規限詩詞之創作，可能已是學術性的討論了。

筆者十多年前開始嘗試自學寫詩填詞，感覺我國數千年文化，凝聚在詩詞之中。可是現代人，尤其是年青人看懂詩詞者已不多，更遑論寫作。如硬把千多年前某人之平仄格律枷鎖扣上，嘗試的人便更少，詩壇零落，承傳乏後，這是我們不願見到的。

愚見認為，文以載道，詩以傳情，能把心中之意以詩，詞之形式寫出，盡量押韻令朗讀時和諧鏗鏘，不必拘泥於各地語系也不同的平仄，鼓勵後學者創意賦詩填詞，百花齊放，煥發詩壇，豈不快哉？

隨意拾詩兩首：木蘭辭首句：織織復織織，五字皆為仄聲。註：木蘭辭

應為南北朝時代之作品，未受沈約之規限所管，好詩得以留傳至今！唐。李商隱名作：「向晚意不適，驅車登古原，夕陽無限好，只是近黃昏。」首句五字全為仄聲（廣東話論），故當年李商隱應不是以廣東話作詩的。可幸的是，沒人敢說李商隱此詩第一句便不合格，否則，「夕陽無限好，只是近黃昏」，這兩句便不能被傳誦千年了。

筆者自幼入讀英文書院，中國語文只有中學程度，大學亦是以英文習醫，故對中國古文學較為疏遠。但身為中國人，不僅對我國文學有興趣，更認為倫理道德此等真正核心價值也極需承傳，故自修文學，宗教，歷史等。寫作詩詞時平仄總是個關！由初學時不知平仄為何物，至懂了平仄，用了平仄，至可用亦可不用，心路歷程，願與大家分享：

見山不知山 何物把我攔

入山看山去 山裡不見山

峰高無坦路 舉步亦艱難

抬頭天際望 山已不是山

天天工開物，那有圓規矩尺？日昇月運，四時交替，那會受人為之規限！詩詞為我國文學瑰寶，齊來寫作，創意無限！振文煥采，道法自然！

平仄論

大匠造物，工如魯班，也要用圓規矩尺，以規矩而成方圓。

歌曲能唱，詩詞可誦，皆因押韻隨律，跌宕起伏，抑揚頓挫。而每首詩也有一定的句數，四句為「絕」詩而八句為「律」詩，絕、律皆可五言或七言，成為規矩，一跟便過了千年。

古代詩歌，始於民謠，唱出了人民的心聲、感情、家鄉的風俗、或歌頌國家、神祇等，稱為風、雅、頌、賦、比、興。至戰國年代屈原之作，寫出他對家國之情懷，更因投江殉國而被稱為愛國詩人。建安時代，曹魏父子（曹操、曹丕、曹植）等詩風豪邁或細膩，各擅勝長，也見句尾押上同韻，卻未成律。每個字的發音可分為四聲（平、上、去、入），平為平聲，其餘上、去、入、為仄聲。

廣東音更把有陰陽的平上去入，加上中入共有九聲，近體詩的格律，皆由南北朝（唐代之前，距今約一千六百年）南齊人沈約所定下，平、仄、黏、對，不能越軌。此後唐、宋至今，只知跟著這規矩來寫，思想、創意，字義也被限制了……回看起來，這位沈約先生卻沒有甚麼好詩詞留下傳世，來個示範！

我國地緣廣闊，由秦始皇開始，書已同文，車已同軌，但各地語音卻相差甚遠，語系繁多，同一個字各地讀音不同，平仄也不一樣。中文最簡單的字，「一」字，廣東音是入（仄）聲，而普通話是平聲，如此類推，由一至十，廣東話只有「三」，一個字為平聲，而普通話「一」、「三」、「七」、「八」、「十」皆為平聲，可見相差之遠。讀者們更可試試，用自己、朋友的名字，以廣東話，普通話，甚至潮州，客家話試試，便知有何不同了。

廣東地處南隅，人卻自負，音調平仄與北方不同，乾脆自詡是語音之正統，

為中原古音，有學者認為，唐、宋歷代皆有中原人士一大規模由北方南下遷徙，由唐之長安，宋之汴京，經粵北之南雄珠璣巷南遷至廣東一帶。大規模的遷徙，皆因戰亂，改朝換代，為免受迫害而遷移，故唐、宋交替之李氏，北宋、南宋滅亡時之趙氏等……但究其規模、每次只百多二百戶人家，約千餘人左右，總數最多也未必過萬，怎能把廣東人的語音完全改變？筆者曾親到中原古都，唐之長安（今西安），北宋之汴京（今開封），南宋之臨安（今杭州），留意聽聽當地人之口音，發覺並沒有和廣東話相似的地方。如此推論，除非當年當地所有人民皆遷移南下，而廣東原地之人民被驅趕滅絕，否則怎會廣東話是中原古音之承傳？

況且，當年北宋覆亡，最大批人是移徙至臨安（今杭州）定都，是為南宋偏安，蘇杭之地，又那有半點似廣府話？更難想像及難以令人相信，當年李白，杜甫等是用廣東話在月下搖首吟詩！九七之時，港人移民美加等地，何止十萬，那會改了美加之方言？自秦以來，車同軌，

對聯篇

我國之文學瑰寶，除詩詞外，對聯也佔重要的一席位。詩詞分別盛於唐宋，元尚曲，明清則是小說與對聯的天下。

顧名思義，對聯是一對兩句，字數相同，名詞、量詞、動詞、形容詞等相襯，而且非常講究平仄，不可偏差。對平仄的要求，基本上是仄起平收，即上聯末字必須仄聲而下聯末字必為平聲。其它字數，一、三、五不論而二、四、六分明，即第二、四、六字於上下聯是要求平仄相對的。上下聯的意義最好是相反，其次是相襯，如兩聯意思全不相關的，便是無情聯了。從意義來看對聯可分為春聯、門聯、賀聯、挽聯、拆字聯、言志聯、景物聯等，其實任何佳句也可成聯。

筆者作了大膽之嘗試，把古哲先賢之佳句配句成聯，雖是狗尾續貂之作，藉此可與先賢溝通，對吟，神馳古今，振文煥采，誠樂事也。

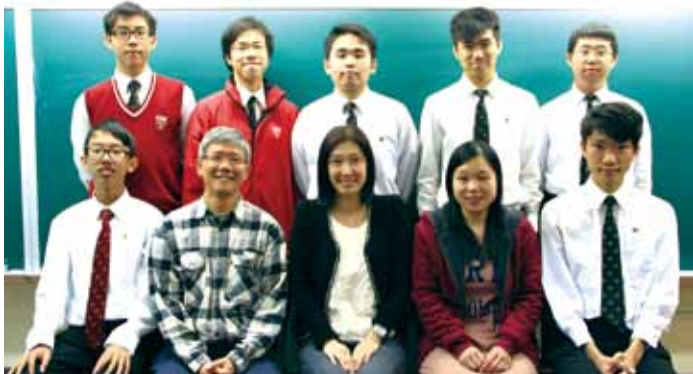

「浪費了的時間無可能追回，最重要是珍惜現在，應馬上開始分配時間讀書……」家安師兄認為現今資訊科技發達，學生的自控能力大不如前，大多將溫書學習拋諸腦後，實有其因果。「對學習需要培養一種興趣，否則弄巧反

拙。」家成師兄則認為要先愛上學習，再強化自己的強項，加以發展。

自力更生 回報父母

「父母由你出世，一直照顧你至到你讀完書，責任就已完成。」家成師兄認為學生要想應如何報答父母的養育之恩，而非繼續依賴父母。但他同時又慨嘆父母對孩子的過份溺愛，以致造成現今學生思考能力偏低問題。「弄致今時今日的局面，社會也有責任……」家安師兄認為學生年紀還小，到成熟一點便可以思考一下社會問題。

家安陳家成師兄畢業後開設了一間公司，

發展自己的事業。看似容易，但有誰知道，創立這公司的背後，流過了多少見證努力和堅持的汗水？

「無讀大學，真的比很多人辛苦……」他們一直後悔自己讀書時渾渾噩噩，以致成績強差人意，進不了大學。於是他們只好到銀行打工，月入僅\$3000，從早上八點工作至晚上兩點，他們都辛苦堅持。可是上天偏愛戲弄人，原本收入穩定卻遇上金融海嘯，連僅有的工作也沒有了。但他們並沒因此而變得沮喪，反而更積極人生。他們不屈服於命運，最終建立自己的公司。

人生的轉捩點

家成師兄原本於畢業後可以選擇重考，但他選擇了入浸會

大學繼續讀書。於浸會大學認識到現在的太太，生活上開始出現了很大的轉變。「有了家室後，做事開始不只是為自己一個人著想，而是要肩負起照顧太子女的責任。學會了承擔，是人生一個巨大的轉捩點。成功絕非易事，只差在你沒有用心去實踐。」家成為自己的辛苦堅持而感到驕傲，其原是因為他認為每個人的一生都必須經歷一個轉捩點，才能認清自己的目標，學懂承擔。

緬懷過去 令人流淚

他們回憶起以往的校園趣事，拿同學的名字開玩笑，操場上遺留下的汗和淚，不禁心生時光飛逝之感。他們提到最難忘的就是一整班人去陸運會和水運會吶喊助威，已成為當時校園生活的一部份。他們又說踏足社會職場後人與人之間難免有利益關係，真心的朋友

的理想。」加上陳師兄自小便常常留意身邊的事物，而且亦喜歡和別人談天說地，和陌生人亦能談得來，便造就了成為記者的夢想。

見證大轉變

陳師兄在校就讀時，正好是陳瑞祺興建新大樓——葉志明樓的時期。「你在課室上課時能看到放在桌上的水樽在震動！」陳師兄提到，當時鄰近的兩所中學也在興建新大樓，四周都是沙塵滾滾的，打樁的砰砰聲響不絕於耳，或多或少都對學習有影響的。

提到昔日的校園生活，最令陳師兄懷念的莫過於一班相識了逾十年的摯友，當中更有數位是由小學時便認識的，直至中七畢業仍是同班同學，可謂十分難得，一個總角之交可不是隨處可找的。

儘管已投身社會工作，但陳師兄仍對昔日老師們的一番教誨和他們在背後默默耕耘銘記於心。「我好欣賞先生（老師）們將自己畢生的精力投放於教育上。」陳師兄說：「在一次聖誕節正日的時候，當

我和其他同學回校參與活動時，卻看見教化學的陳家成老師和郭桂芬老師在埋頭苦幹。」此外，師兄亦提起另一位已退休的老師——陳振源老師，「他每天都會派一張手寫在白報紙上再影印的英文工作紙給我們，每天都是不同的英文練習！」陳瑞祺的老師對教學的熱誠毫無保留的展現出來，他們將畢生的精力投放於工作上，能在眾師的汗水下為自己未來的人生作好準備，絕對是一眾水記仔的福份。

相信近幾屆的水記仔都對外籍校監沒太多的認識，然而，這卻是一眾師兄們的校園回憶之一。「Bohet（修士、校監）給我們一種威嚴的形象。」陳師兄說：「他手上的文具板總夾著所有班別的時間表，方便他來視察！」回想起來，校監或許就是讓陳瑞祺樹立良好校風的最重要的人。

事在人為

近年來陳瑞祺的各項成績均有下滑的情況出現，陳師兄認為各人的學習能力總有差異，總不可能全校的學生都是考第一的材料，成績下滑的情況出現總不是可避免的事。何況今時今日的學生有多項的活

動參加，又有不少的玩意的引誘，難免讓的學生不能專注於學習上，可不是每個人都夠在各方面上都和學業並重的。「若要處理的事情太多時便要學會排序。」只要能好好分配時間，就自然有足夠的時間去讀書，不會被其他事情阻礙。另一方面，陳師兄亦提到現時的學生們都缺乏信心，「就像是我在大學時打柔道，出拳、出腳時總是被師傅責怪不夠決心。」陳師兄勉勵道：「要多加力度去做事！」

此外，陳師兄亦談到現時大多的小孩都因各種電子產品的普及而少留意身邊的事物，只留意螢幕上的光彩，加上思考又缺乏批判性，因此建議師弟們能透過多觀察來訓練思考，而且做事時不要太規範，培養多角度思考的習慣。在生活中，亦能多看報章，留意不同的事物，對於找出自己的目標有莫大的幫助，「成功？事在人為而已！」

踏入新聞行業

陳師兄畢業於樹仁大學新聞系，現於星島日報任職記者。訪問中問到他在高中時和在大學時所選修的科目有何不同，若然是毫不相關，會不會有困難，「其實讀新聞系並不困難，反而我覺得四年的過程是享受的。」即使在高中時選讀的是理科，但對於從小便喜愛閱讀如地圖、百科全書等資料性書籍的陳師兄來說，高中所讀的科目並沒有成為了他大學的選科的枷鎖，一直以來的興趣反成了有助他未來工作的重要一環。「喜歡閱讀資料性書籍只是我夢想的一個輕微定型。」陳師兄說：「別人可能在初中時已有明確的目標，如在中三、中四時已考慮到將來讀醫科，所以選讀了理科，而我當時並未有明確的目標要當記者，直至做校刊後才確立自己

二零零六年離職。然而，在她任職期間卻發生了許多刻骨銘心的人與事，也十分值得借此機會和讀者分享一下……

陳太慶幸自己在水記的日子大多是愉快的，在初入職時和劉銘恩老師、梁韻玲老師和謝綺玲老師結為好友，也因為共屬中文部，所以塑造了共同話題。陳太又憶述她們在歌唱比賽時一同歌唱美少女時代的畫面仍然歷歷在目，也因為她們的友情深厚，漸漸被人譽為水記的「四朵金花」。

難忘的學生

當被問到她與學生的關係和相處之道，她二話不說的答了：有教無類。陳太很嚮往與學生溝通，願意將自己的空餘時間都投放在學生身上：陪伴學生打籃球、陪伴學生坐在紅燈山上觀賞日落。隨著時光的流逝，陳太成為了頑劣學生的傾訴對象，他們之間有着一份信任，而這份信任是靠着陳太用心機和時間打造出來的，對每一位學生也充滿了愛。

令陳太最難忘的學生是於一九九六年逝世的張智陽。張同學和他的朋友是被學校認為是壞學生一族，至少也難成大器。然而，他們很喜愛與陳太談天，他們無所不談，小至談情、大至未來的職業都與陳太分享，所以培養了頗親密的師生關係。一日下午，陳太在放學回家途中接到黎S(已退休老師)的來電：「有一班學生想見你，因為有一個學生死了，叫你去案發現場，他們等你。」聽完後，她便趕到現場，看見了封鎖線、看見了封鎖線裏一班驚恐學生坐在地上、看見了地上的粉筆痕。張同學死了。他與朋友在山上嬉戲時，因不小心直墮地面當場離世。在這段期間，陳太一直陪伴他們，陪他們傾訴、陪他們拜祭，直到現在也記憶猶新，而這件事也為她帶來了反省，老師遇到這些時刻，應該怎樣做，怎樣面對學生、怎樣面對死者的家長。
