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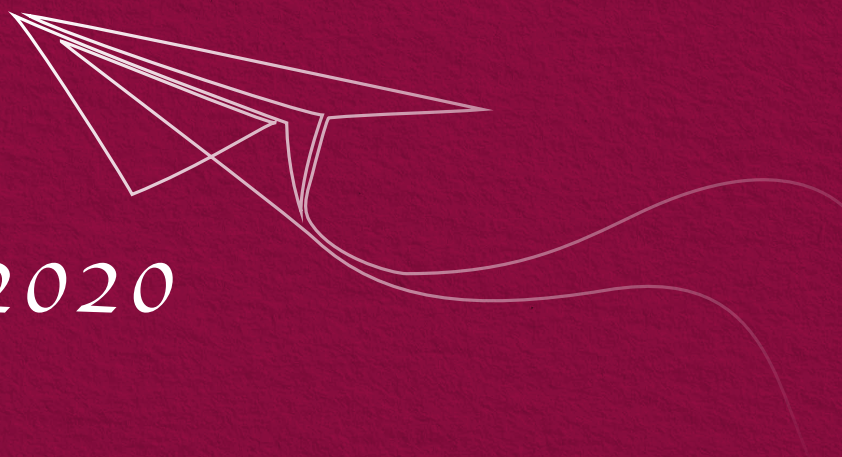

Message Of His Holiness Pope Francis For The 35th World Youth Day 2020

"Young man, I say to you, arise!" (Lk 7:14)

Dear Young People,

In October 2018, with the Synod of Bishops on Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment, the Church undertook a process of reflection on your place in today's world, your search for meaning and purpose in life, and your relationship with God. In January 2019, I met with hundreds of thousands of your contemporaries from throughout the world assembled in Panama for World Youth Day. Events of this type – the Synod and World Youth Day – are an expression of a fundamental dimension of the Church: the fact that we "journey together".

In this journey, every time we reach an important milestone, we are challenged by God and by life to make a new beginning. As young people, you are experts in this! You like to take trips, to discover new places and people, and to have new experiences. That is why I have chosen the city of Lisbon, the capital of Portugal, as the goal of our next intercontinental pilgrimage, to take place in 2022. From Lisbon, in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries, great numbers of young people, including many missionaries, set out for unknown lands, to share their experience of Jesus with other peoples and nations. The theme of the Lisbon World Youth Day will be: "Mary arose and went with haste" (Lk 1:39). In these two intervening years, I want to reflect with you on two other biblical texts: for 2020, "Young man, I say to you, arise!" (Lk 7:14) and for 2021, "Stand up. I appoint you as a witness of what you have seen" (cf. Acts 26:16).



As you can see, the verb "arise" or "stand up" appears in all three themes. These words also speak of resurrection, of awakening to new life. They are words that constantly appear in the Exhortation *Christus Vivit* (Christ is Alive!) that I addressed to you following the 2018 Synod and that, together with the Final Document, the Church offers you as a lamp to shed light on your path in life. I sincerely hope that the journey bringing us to Lisbon will coincide with a great effort on the part of the entire Church to implement these two documents and to let them guide the mission of those engaged in the pastoral care of young people.

Let us now turn to this year's theme: "Young man, I say to you, arise!" (cf. Lk 7:14). I mentioned this verse of the Gospel in *Christus Vivit*: "If you have lost your vitality, your dreams, your enthusiasm, your optimism and your generosity, Jesus stands before you as once he stood before the dead son of the widow, and with all the power of his resurrection he urges you: 'Young man, I say to you, arise!'" (No. 20).

That passage from the Bible tells us how Jesus, upon entering the town of Nain in Galilee, came upon the funeral procession of a young person, the only son of a widowed mother. Jesus, struck by the woman's heartrending grief, miraculously restored her son to life. The miracle took place after a sequence of words and gestures: "When the Lord saw her, he had compassion for her and said to her, 'Do not weep.' Then he came forward and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still" (Lk 7:13-14). Let us take a moment to meditate on these words and gestures of the Lord.

The ability to see pain and death

Jesus looks carefully at this funeral procession. In the midst of the crowd, he makes out the face of a woman in great pain. His ability to see generates encounter, the source of new life. Few words are needed.

What about my own ability to see? When I look at things, do I look carefully, or is it more like when I quickly scroll through the thousands of photos or social profiles on my cell phone? How often do we end up being eyewitnesses of events without ever experiencing them in real time! Sometimes our

first reaction is to take a picture with our cell phone, without even bothering to look into the eyes of the persons involved.

All around us, but at times also within us, we can see realities of death: physical, spiritual, emotional, social. Do we really notice them, or simply let them happen to us? Is there anything we can do in order to restore life?

I think too of all those negative situations that people of your age are experiencing. Some stake everything on the present moment and risk their own lives in extreme experiences. Others are “dead” because they feel hopeless. One young woman told me: “Among my friends I see less desire to get involved, less courage to get up”. Sadly, depression is spreading among young people too, and in some cases even leads to the temptation to take one’s own life. How many situations are there where apathy reigns, where people plunge into an abyss of anguish and remorse! How many young people cry out with no one to hear their plea! Instead, they meet with looks of distraction and indifference on the part of people who want to enjoy their own “happy hour”, without being bothered about anyone or anything else.

Others waste their lives with superficial things, thinking they are alive while in fact they are dead within (cf. Rev 3:1). At the age of twenty, they can already be dragging their lives down, instead of raising them up to the level of their true dignity. Everything is reduced to “living it up” and seeking a morsel of gratification: a minute of entertainment, a fleeting moment of attention and affection from others... And what about the widespread growing digital narcissism that affects young people and adults alike. All too many people are living this way! Some of them have perhaps bought into the materialism of those all around them who are concerned only with making money and taking it easy, as if these were the sole purpose of life. In the long run, this will inevitably lead to unhappiness, apathy and boredom with life, a growing sense of emptiness and frustration.

Negative situations can also be the result of personal failure, whenever something we care about, something we were committed to, no longer seems to be working or giving the desired results. This can happen with school or with our ambitions in sports and in the arts... The end of the “dream” can make us feel dead. But failures are part of the life of every human being; sometimes they can also end up being a grace! Not infrequently, something that we thought would bring

us happiness proves to be an illusion, an idol. Idols demand everything from us; they enslave us yet they give us nothing in return. And in the end they collapse, leaving only a cloud of dust. Failure, if it makes our idols

collapse, is a good thing, however much suffering it involves.

There are many other situations of physical or moral death that a young person may encounter. I think of addiction, crime, poverty or grave illness. I leave it to you to think about these things and to realize what has proved “deadly” for yourselves or for someone close to you, now or in the past. At the same time, I ask you to remember that the young man in the Gospel was truly dead, but he was able to come back to life because he was seen by Someone who wanted him to live. The same thing can also happen to us, today and every day.



To have compassion

The Scriptures often speak of the feelings experienced by those who let themselves be touched “viscerally” by the pain of others. Jesus’ own feelings make him share in other people’s lives. He makes their pain his own. That mother’s grief became his own. The death of that young son became his own.

As young people, you have shown over and over again that you are capable of com-*passion*. I think of all those of you who have generously offered help whenever situations demanded it. No disaster, earthquake or flood takes place without young volunteers stepping up to offer a helping hand. The great mobilization of young people concerned about defending the environment is also a witness to your ability to hear the cry of the earth.

Dear young people, do not let yourselves be robbed of this sensitivity! May you always be attentive to the plea of those who are suffering, and be moved by those who weep and die in today’s world. “Some realities of life are only seen with eyes cleansed by tears” (Christus Vivit, 76). If you can learn to weep with those who are weeping, you will

find true happiness. So many of your contemporaries are disadvantaged and victims of violence and persecution. Let their wounds become your own, and you will be bearers of hope in this world. You will be able to say to your brother or sister: “Arise, you are not alone”, and you will help them realize that God the Father loves us, that Jesus is the hand he stretches out to us in order to raise us up.

To come forward and “touch”

Jesus stops the funeral procession. He draws near, he demonstrates his closeness. Closeness thus turns into a courageous act of restoring life to another. A prophetic gesture. The touch of Jesus, the living One, communicates life. It is a touch that pours the Holy Spirit into the dead body of that young man and brings him back to life.

That touch penetrates all hurt and despair. It is the touch of God himself, a touch also felt in authentic human love; it is a touch opening up unimaginable vistas of freedom and fullness of new life. The effectiveness of this gesture of Jesus is incalculable. It reminds us that even one sign of closeness, simple yet concrete, can awaken forces of resurrection.

You too, as young people, are able to draw near to the realities of pain and death that you encounter. You too can touch them and, like Jesus, bring new life, thanks to the Holy Spirit. But only if you are first touched by his love, if your heart is melted by the experience of his goodness towards you. If you can feel God’s immense love for every living creature – especially our brothers and sisters who experience

hunger and thirst, or are sick or naked or imprisoned – then you will be able to draw near to them as he does. You will be able to touch them as he does, and to bring his life to those of your friends who are inwardly dead, who suffer or have lost faith and hope.

“Young man, I say to you, arise!”

The Gospel does not tell us the name of the young man whom Jesus restored to life in Nain. This invites each reader to identify with him. To you, to me, to each one of us, Jesus says: “Arise”. We are very aware that, as Christians, we constantly fall and have to get up again. People who are not on a journey never fall; then again, neither do they move forward. That is why we need to accept the help that Jesus gives us and put our faith in God. The first step is to let ourselves get up and to realize that the new life Jesus offers us is good and worth living. It is sustained by one who is ever at our side along our journey to the future. Jesus helps us to live this life in a dignified and meaningful way.

This life is really a new creation, a new birth, not just a form of psychological conditioning. Perhaps, in times of difficulty, many of you have heard people repeat those “magic” formulas so fashionable nowadays, formulas that are supposed to take care of everything: “You have to believe in yourself”, “You have to discover your inner resources”, “You have to become conscious of your positive energy”... But these are mere words; they do not work for someone who is truly “dead inside”. Jesus’ word has a deeper resonance; it goes infinitely deeper. It is a divine and creative word, which alone can bring the dead to life.

Living the new life as “risen ones”

The Gospel tells us that the young man “began to speak” (Lk 7:15). Those touched and restored to life by Jesus immediately speak up and express without hesitation or fear what has happened deep within them: their personality, desires, needs and dreams. Perhaps they were never able to do this before, for they thought no one would be able to understand.

To speak also means to enter into a relationship with others. When we are “dead”, we remain closed in on ourselves. Our relationships break up, or become superficial, false and hypocritical. When Jesus restores us to life, he “gives” us to others (cf. v 15).



Today, we are often “connected” but not communicating. The indiscriminate use of electronic devices can keep us constantly glued to the screen. With this Message, I would like to join you, young people, in calling for a cultural change, based on Jesus’ command to “arise”. In a culture that makes young people isolated and withdrawn into virtual worlds, let us spread Jesus’ invitation: “Arise!” He calls us to embrace a reality that is so much more than virtual. This does not involve rejecting technology, but rather using it as a means and not as an end. “Arise!” is also an invitation to “dream”, to “take a risk”, to be “committed to changing the world”, to rekindle your hopes and aspirations, and to contemplate the heavens, the stars and the world around you. “Arise and become what you are!” If this is our message, many young people will stop looking bored and weary, and let their faces come alive and be more beautiful than any virtual reality.

If you give life, someone will be there to receive it. As a young woman once said: “Get off your couch when you see something beautiful, and try and do something similar”. Beauty awakes passion. And if a young person is passionate about something, or even better, about someone, he or she will arise and start to do great things. Young people will rise from the dead, become witnesses to Jesus and devote their lives to him.

Dear young people, what are your passions and dreams? Give them free rein and, through them, offer the world, the Church and other young people something beautiful, whether in the realm of the spirit, the arts or society. I repeat what I once told you in my mother tongue: Hagan lío! Make your voices heard! I remember another young person who said: “If Jesus was someone who was only concerned about himself, the son of the widow would not have been raised”.

The resurrection of that young man restored him to his mother. In that woman, we can see an image of Mary, our Mother, to whom we entrust all the young people of our world. In her, we can also recognize the Church, who wants to welcome with tender love each young person, without exception. So let us implore Mary’s intercession for the Church, that she may always be a mother for her dead children, weeping for them and asking that they be restored to life. In every one of her children who dies, the Church also dies, and in every one of her children who arises, the Church also arises.

I bless your journey. And I ask you, please, not to forget to pray for me.

Supervisor's Message

The school year 2019-2020 was a big year for CSK as it celebrated its 50th anniversary. The school has been preparing for the big event for a few years. It was an unforgettable year for everyone.

The major event to mark the opening of the celebrations was the Open Day in December 2019. It was a warm sunny day that welcomed a total of seven La Salle Brothers who officiated the opening of the event. Students, teachers, staff, friends from other Lasallian schools, old boys and friends, with a total number of about two thousand people all enjoyed some exciting and memorable moments at CSK.

At the beginning of the school year, a handful of La Salle Brothers were posted to Hong Kong to help with the Lasallian schools in the territory. We are fortunate that Brother Michael was posted to CSK. Brother Michael coordinated the religious and spiritual programs and he took up more responsibility in teaching.

During the first half of the school year, classes were disrupted intermittently by social unrest. Students were affected physically and emotionally by incidents never seen before. Social workers counselled student who needed services. In December, on the bright side, CSK student Lau Yu Ka Larry was selected as Winner of the Hong Kong Outstanding Students Award, while Chan Man Ho was selected as Finalist. The honour was a true reflection on the contribution they both have provided to society.

In the second half of the school year classes and school activities were hit even more harshly by the pandemic. Classes were conducted online. Students and teachers met remotely through a small display. Class communication and face-to-face human interaction were lost. Daily activity was confined to a small space. People faced difficulties and challenges of such magnitude never hitherto imagined. Tens of thousands of people have lost their lives, and the number is still growing. Students in some less-fortunate regions have lost the opportunity to attend school. Let us pray that the disease will go away soon and people will return to a normal life.

The 50th anniversary dinner originally scheduled for February 22, 2020 was moved to January 30, 2021. Let's hope that we will eventually meet at the venue of the dinner, which the organizing committee has put in tremendous effort to arrange already.

Before signing off, I would like to say a sincere thanks to Mrs Betsy Chan and Mr TS Wong who are both retiring after this school year. Both of them served CSK for many years whole-heartedly. I do hope that they will enjoy their lives with their families.

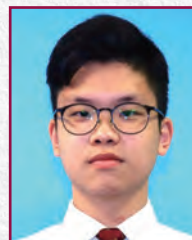

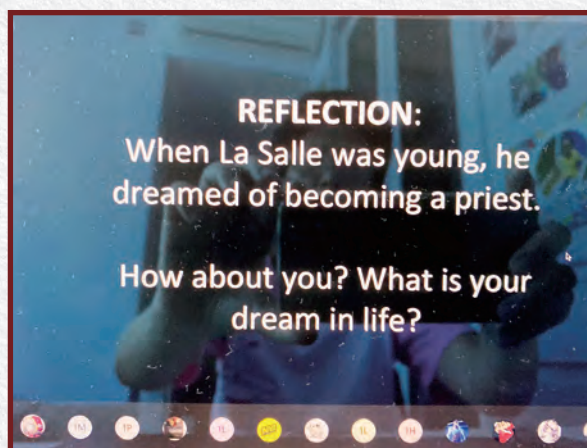

AFS Exchange Program

Having foreign students staying in CSK for a year has always been a tradition. This year, Ondřej from Czech Republic is involved in our school as an exchange student. Despite the cancellation of the exchange program due to the pandemic, he still has some thoughts about his journey in Hong Kong.

Having three younger siblings in Czech, Ondřej is educated to be a responsible and well-mannered person so as to be a role model for his younger brother and sisters. During his stay in Hong Kong, he lived in Mong Kok with his host family which included a host brother, whom he shared a room with. He had a good relationship with him.

As schools at Ondřej's hometown are mostly co-educational schools, studying in a single-sex school is a new experience for him. The need of wearing school uniform is also something he has never come across, as his school doesn't require students to put on uniforms, so it takes him some time to get used to this school rule. Another thing he struggled with is the increased amount of homework, which is five times more than what he had in his own country.

In spite of the hardship that Ondřej had during his adaptation, he still finds something interesting. He said, 'I have played rugby for four years, but for a public team. In Hong Kong, each school has its own school teams, which is not the same as Czech. The idea of school teams is amazing in my opinion, because it allows every student to try new sports easily.'

Hey there, my name is Ondřej, it is a bit difficult to pronounce, so if you ever meet me just call me Andrew. Anyway I am an exchange student from the Czech Republic and I am going to stay in Hong Kong for one year. I have lived with a host family for almost two months and I have a host brother, whom I share a room with. Back in Czech, I have a 13-year-old brother and two little sisters, who are two and three years old respectively. Most of our schools are co-educational. We also do not wear school uniform and do not really have so much homework. However, the good thing about studying here is that each school has its own school teams. In Czech, I had played rugby for four years for a public team. The idea of having your own school teams is really good in my opinion, because it allows you to try new sports pretty easily.

Hong Kong's culture is very different from that of Czech in many ways. I really like the food here. I force myself to try all kinds of food on the table that I have not tried before. To be honest, I have never regretted this except once or twice. The dining customs here are also different and they have taken me a while to adapt to, but that is why I am here in Hong Kong, to experience a new culture, people, language, food and other things.

With his talents towards sports and strong mentality, Ondřej had been a school team member since the beginning of this academic year and he had proven himself by achieving the third place in the annual cross-country contest. He is also good at football as many of the schoolmates who played football with him have complimented him on his skillful moves.



Among all the differences between Hong Kong and Czech culture, Ondřej found the food culture the most different. In his early days in Hong Kong, he forced himself to try every dish he was served, traditional Chinese dim sum like shumai, cha siu bao and even chicken feet, which many Westerners find it disgusting. 'The dishes here are different from Czech, so it takes me a while to adapt to them, but that's why I came to Hong Kong, to try new things, learn new culture, people, language and food,' he said.

Although Ondřej's journey to Hong Kong doesn't last long, but he still finds it memorable and he is glad that he has applied for the exchange program. 'I really recommend everyone around my age to go and study somewhere abroad. Trust me, you'll never regret. It's a really good experience and you probably won't have a lot of opportunities like this in your life, so don't miss the chance!'

An Interview with Mr. M H Ying

Stay Gold, Stay Artish - Mr Travis Ying

Once an airport ground staff member, once a school teacher, Mr. Ying is now a freelance artist in Hong Kong. Other than a lettering artist, he has also been the instructor of our school's Drama Club for years, and is looking forward to guiding the club through its upcoming eleventh show. From a 20-minute one-act play way back when to an hour full-length show, even he is amazed by how far the club has come.

The Artist's Way

Just like a student, Mr Ying was introduced to drama in his secondary school, but it didn't stick. Not until university did he resume his adventure in drama. He realised that drama intrigued him, whether as an actor or stagehand, the feeling of having people around who work together makes him feel warm. Having that in mind, he then further studied theatre and entertainment arts, he even organised several dramas with his friends after graduation.

People often hold the misconception that artists cannot make a living, but Mr Ying has disproved that notion with action. By standing at the diverging road of education and arts, he has made himself clear, that he wants to be an artist more than anything else. "Certainly you might not make a fortune being an artist, but it does support your daily life." He sees the pursuit of his own dream as more valuable than other goals. Now, he is a lettering artist, and also a drama instructor.

Passion in Drama

Rehearsing for a drama is really an uphill task. A mere hour-long show, might take up to months of planning and training. In CSK, the drama club might have to rehearse first thing in the morning or till late-night at school, burning the candle at both ends. Despite the nomenclature "play", it is not easy task. "It is actually quite under the gun, especially in March or April, when all schools are rehearsing for the Drama Festival." He is the drama instructor of several schools, and the time clashes can give him headaches. "I once fell asleep during a rehearsal, sometimes it's so harsh that I feel as though I can't bear it." Not only for Mr Ying, the hectic rehearsing schedule is great challenge for the drama club as

well. Despite their hardships, what impresses Mr Ying the most is the passion of CSK students.

"It is quite touching to see the enthusiasm of the drama club in every performance." He mentioned that drama club members really help one another to achieve their one aim: to have a good show. Actors, stagehands, audio, lighting, etc. They are all together as one. "Sometimes I run out of ideas, and I do need help from the students." The inspirations and the ideas for a drama show can actually come from any club member. The script is written together and the drama is performed together unlike professional drama production teams, in which roles and duties are clearly demarcated. "[In professional production teams] the relationship between the crew seems to be distant, the bond seems to have gone." The teamwork and the passion is the momentum which runs the drama club.

Mr Ying also revealed that many arts and performance groups acclaim CSK dramas as really outstanding among



secondary schools, and there is a reason behind this. “Most schools might be over-protective of their students, which might actually be ‘spoon-feeding’ sometimes.” He explained, “some schools do not allow student to stay in campus so late, some might even require all students to leave the premises by 5 p.m., there is not much time for drama rehearsals after school.” Mr Ying thinks that the difference between CSK dramas and other schools’ shows is the effort made by the club. CSK club members really give it their all - blood, sweat and tears - for a good show. Seeing that his students are willing to devote such time to drama, Mr Ying is really pleased.

Staying Gold

Whilst the club were disappointed that the coronavirus pandemic put an end to their long-prepared show, Mr Ying admitted that he also supported the cancellation of the show due to concerns over the safety of the students. However, he did not expect the drama club to exhibit such keenness in their performance, especially the F.5 boys. “I didn’t know that they were really upset about not having a performance.” But

as lessons resumed, Mr Ying hesitated when answering if a rescheduled show in mid-October were possible. He once again asked the club, their answer had never wavered, “It is really touching and impressive to know that they have such eagerness to put on a drama, and even if the show is called off again, they will still hope to and be ready to perform on stage.” He was really surprised by how the club members were staying true to themselves, and holding onto their beliefs.

Apart from the Drama Club, Mr Ying is also hugely affected by the pandemic. “I am now in ‘retirement,’” he jokingly said. “All my calligraphy classes, drama classes, design jobs are all gone — zero work, zero income.” It is undeniably hard to carry on in such circumstances, but Mr Ying said, “that’s my choice.” To him, it is all expected once he chose to be an artist. Despite the uncertainties, he keeps on chasing his goal to be an artist without compromise. In his ‘retirement’ life, he still did not give up being artistic, he learnt a new instrument - cello - and also kept on creating new artworks, an optimistic philosophy which is truly ‘staying gold, and staying artisth’.

Mr Ying shared a lyric from the song “為執著乾杯” by 藍奕邦：

My Past Six Years in CSK

Looking back over those six years, from the moment I stepped into this school for the first time to where I stand today, as the winner of the 34th Hong Kong Outstanding Student Award, my myriad achievements not only humble me, but also accelerate my momentum and hunger to improve myself further. Instead of focusing on sharing something as cliché and mundane as my appreciation to everyone who supported me along the way, more importantly I want to share with you my journey and what I learnt from it.

One could say young children are always looking for new ways to accidentally kill themselves because they are driven by an unstoppable force of innocent curiosity. For instance, a young toddler might eat a coin to experience the taste of metal. I wish I could try it out too, but, alas, we are ever turning into a cashless society. Eventually though, the exploratory phase exhausts itself, not because we run out of world to explore, but rather the exploratory phase wraps up as we become older.

Being a grownup means being rational and logical, but I have seen many people drop their drive of innocent curiosity just

for the sake of being recognised as ordinary and normal. Normality is not telling yourself not to try new things or not to say “Yes!” to anything that comes your way. Here’s a very typical example. I was not a very good student, in fact, I have never been a good student at all. When I was in Form 1, the English teacher did not invite me to join the English Debating Team because, at that time, my English was terrible. I could barely pass my grammar quizzes. Therefore, I turned to the Chinese Debating Team and I wandered there for a couple of years. I basically gave up the thought of joining the English team.

Miss Lee, who is now our team advising teacher, approached me a few years later and harnessed my debating energy to good use. She gave me a chance to join the team. Normally, people just turn her down because people at that have lost all of their innocent curiosity. Even if you believe you still possess some of that force, I assume you would rather invest all of it into DSE. But I said ‘Yes!’ and I quit the Chinese Debating Team the following year.

I have never regretted anything since. That was when miracles started to appear. I won my first debate championship and took three best debater awards in my first English Debating Competition, the Hong Kong Secondary School Debating Competition or – as we call it - HKSSDC. A year later, I became the captain of the team and successfully led my teammates Joshua, Christian and Clement, to win numerous trophies in subsequent years. I was always the best debater: 27 such awards in just 3 years. Throughout those competitions, arguing about government’s policies and social issues, I was able to gain multi-faceted knowledge that cut across several disciplines outside the normal academic subjects, and most importantly, improve my rigorous higher order and critical thinking skills. Such skills helped me in each and every debating contest and, ultimately, paved my way to Law School.

I love debating and it is my life. It makes my body and my mind feel unstoppable. Once, during the third round of the Sing Tao debate competition, I had to undergo three surgeries. Throughout, I continued to participate in the quarter-final and semi-final because, as the captain, I had to maintain the momentum of our team. It was really a tough

time for me. I remember that my wound oozed whilst I was on stage and I had to take a tremendous amount of pain-killers just to stay focussed on the competition. Although it was extremely painful and torturous, it was worthwhile. I learnt that self-belief is important, but you also have to persevere and never give up despite the difficulties.

So, innocent curiosity, beyond all other human abilities, is the driving force to success. In my world, how curious I was determined how successful I would be. If I had bowed down to failures easily, or said, "No," to any 'impossible' missions, my life would certainly be filled with enormous boredom and all of the miracles aforementioned definitely would not have existed.

For generations, we have known that we must try new things surrounding us in order to reveal and fulfill our potential. I wonder how many of you can jump out of the box. When I joined the 34th Hong Kong Outstanding Student Election, I just thought it was a game to lose. But I did not give up so easily. I tried. Have you ever felt a sense of inferiority? Or when seeing on social media how your friends are enjoying themselves, have you ever felt envious? These were my feelings in the election period. I harvested them and used them as motivation.

There were times when I felt like a lonely blossom in a wheat field. But I utilised curiosity and braveness to overcome such self-doubt. I tried to combat all the greatness I was up against. My competitors were phenomenal, there were some well-known debaters and talented musicians. Their press reports frankly were more than the sum of the academic reports I had received since Primary One. I did not lose my faith though. I tried. I persisted with my curiosity. I persevered with hope as though there were nothing to lose.

Apparently, the judges saw my potential and I succeeded. I snatched the award as the Hong Kong Outstanding Student. I am very grateful for the opportunities I had these past six years. We should all strive to perceive a new angle, an angle to cut in on the things that surround us every second, every minute, every day and offer up a new perspective. Innocent curiosity is something we are born with. Some general principles emerge in our minds but we have to uphold our true nature and not refuse to try new things and to create new orders.

We all have to play by the rules of society because we will, more often than not, be rewarded. This is the basis of a communal relationship in society, and, quite frankly, we all have bumped into troubles when we ignore this supreme rule



of life. But my experience shows you that if you are willing to make some changes, to be curious and brave to join in new things, we can be rewarded as well, if not, more than when we play by the rules.

DSE is the rule in our secondary school life and I know it must be very hard to spare some time for jumping out of the curriculum. I have tried it, though, and I got into Law School, so maybe you should try it too. It is a way for you to become extraordinary and find yourself on the path to greatness. There are too much potential experiences out there and the sheer magnitude of our existence is overwhelming. So, we have to understand ourselves and make the right decision, if not, the consequences can be severe, and one of them is time-wasting.

Thus, exploring yourself requires Galileo-like patience. Not everyone can find their true love at first sight. Frankly, I spent many years wandering around in different societies and teams. This is why we have to be curious all the time, so we can find our own way to be great.

None of us were meant to be common. We all have our dreams. So, aren't we all explorers, seeking out new lands? My years in the Debating Team helped me to ignore the darkness surrounding me. I had been a blackhole in the classroom for too long, absorbing all the information but failing to put it to any use. Those days were done. Debating and Miss Lee enlightened this dying planet.

I hope my story can inspire galaxies of greatness for generations to come. Thank you, CSK, for giving me such unforgettable and enjoyable experiences.

So, please remember, the sky is not the limit, but rather it is only the beginning. Live up.

前言

是年為我校金禧五十周年。今年，我校有幸在一名師兄的慷慨捐輸下新設一獎學金，當中善款約三十萬。相信大家會對善長的身份大感興趣，而他就是師兄——蔣偉傑先生。採訪當日，獎學金的三位得主也同場出席訪問。

早於少時，師兄已懷有成爲程式交易員的念頭。於是自幼便默默以此爲目標，長大後也成功投身程式交易，現在他在這行的成就也非常卓越！目前師兄的業務以分析網絡為主，並嘗試以企業家身份改變社會。

獎學金的緣起

原來師兄投身社會數載後，希望能藉己力貢獻社會，於是萌生幫助師弟的念頭。師兄本來希望師弟可以專注學業，無須為學費分神、犧牲時間打工賺取學費，並有更多空餘時間作全面發展，於是慢慢促成是次獎學金計劃，也希望藉此訪問為後輩解答疑難。

資訊科技的未來發展趨勢

師兄直言目前香港的軟件開發(Software development)前景不大，職位供求也不多，何況中港兩地收入差異大，僱主大可以聘用質素相近的數名中國畢業生取代一位香港畢業生，故此要有心理準備。惟有提升自身能力，方有本錢選擇路途、實踐理想。

但師兄認為隨各種科技人工智能的發展和興起，日後社會對「編程(programming)」的需求會增加，可能屆時連一般人也要對其運作或原理有基礎認識方能應用科技。據師兄所述，原來星加坡目前要求學生初中起學習大量編程課程，甚至要求初中學生能掌握簡單編碼技能。因此他認為教育局未來若按世界大勢制定課程綱要，相信香港日後亦會加重編程學習。

做到最好！

師兄指正是當初他比同輩更早接觸程式交易，只因稍勝同輩發展而取得今日的成就。因此他再三強調要常常提醒自己在某範疇中要達至頂峰，否則便會落後於人。他也鼓勵同學勇於追求課外知識，嘗試拓展課堂以外的資訊知識，更指自己今天的

成就某程度取決於當初拓展的技能，他再三鼓勵同學在大學嘗試發展新知，不怕艱苦、迎難而上。

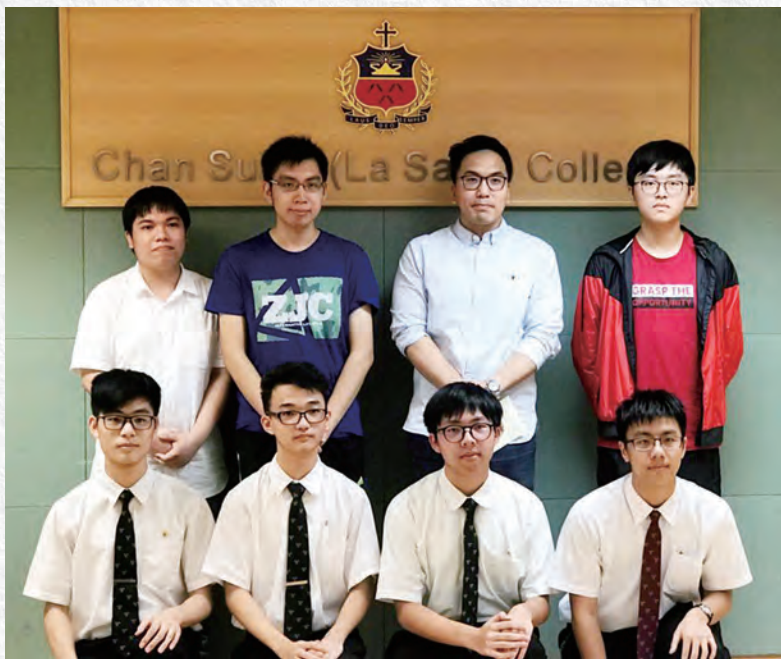
資訊科技人員的氣魄

他提醒「一個成功的資訊科技人員」態度上不應向錢看。應嘗試找到合適自己的發展方向，全力發展成為行內的專才。

他勤勉有意修讀電腦相關科目的人，必須富有熱誠、認清目標，瞭解自己的長處並加以發展。若然沒有動力，可能如同他的同學一樣最終選擇轉行。除此以外，也應該把握自己接受香港教育的優勢，盡可能運用兩文三語的優勢對外發展，汲取各國人才經驗。

資訊科技範疇多而廣，其學問往往令人百思不得其解。他建議尋找一名「導師」交流，每當感到困惑或是遇上阻滯時詢問意見、觀察過來人的做法。另外也應自行設定目標嘗試發展。





事有先後緩急 宜認清自我

問及興趣與學業應該如何分配，師兄則稱對他而言其實兩者是一體的，無法分離，但他強調時間分配非常重要。師兄勸勉同學要學懂「事有先後緩急」，分辨事情重要與否。時間有限，面對家庭、事業、興趣等各個方面就必然有所取捨、優次，要三思衡量自己的內心真實所想。

如何判斷重要與否？師兄則建議試想像十年後的自己，想著自己想成為怎樣的人。思考自己和那個模範者的距離，摸索如何成為那個模範者，繼而判斷什麼因素和行為方為最重要。因為行為正是推進自我發展的媒介，一旦辨清，該如何取捨、什麼應該執行，自然一目了然。每個人總會有目標，例如師兄不甘為富人打工，同時又想為社會貢獻，於是決心辭任銀行職務並運用學識籌辦公司，繼而確保員工生活受保障，另外師兄也希望透過今次獎學金計劃，栽培能於資訊科技界發展的師弟。

追憶母校

回憶當年舊事，歷屆的畢業生也總不約而同地提起「瑞祺」自由、包容的作風。除此之外，在陳瑞祺七年間，師兄每有新事物有意學習時，在學校也能找到所需的資源和教材，甚至遇上家庭問題也有良師在旁支援著他。他特別提及仍然執教的黃永坤老師，感激他在師兄處於困難、情緒崩潰時願意開解他，提供當時師兄最需要的支援，始終如及時雨般帶來幫助。

除此以外，師兄指出在事業和科技而言，陳瑞祺七年中也成功發掘到原來自己擅於科技，也感言有幸當時有位學業良好的同學激勵他互相競賽、一同進步。

前路何處歸？

相信不少同學仍然對前途迷惘。師兄認為各人長處不一，在大學更是尤其突出各人的長短處。他以法律系學生為例，指出工商管理學學士及法學士學生往往能言善辯、語文能力較佳，相比其他學系自然於演講場合更為處優。他寄語同學摸索適合自己的路，若然及早察覺不適合的發展方向，也可以轉移探索其他適合自己的路。

師兄寄語無論自己所處的位置如何，只需知道自己想往什麼方向走便足矣。及早知道自己想向哪個方向走，一切的限制也再不能限制你，一切取決於決心和意志。他又以自己為例子，指出縱然自己先天資源乏缺，但也能藉著陳瑞祺七年的學習生涯中，朝著目標走。

臨別贈言

訪問本已結束，但會議室內氣氛仍然熾熱，幸好師兄也樂意繼續與我們閑話幾句。內容紀錄不多，但此句是筆者牢記於心。他承認為人處世要開心的確困難，但卻是做人最重要的事，故此他勉勵同學，不要因此刻做不到而放棄自己。

紀念聖約翰喇沙逝世三百年彌撒

背景

現時，超過一百萬名來自約八十個國家的學生，正接受喇沙會的教育。而香港共有九間由喇沙會開辦的學校。而一手創立基督學校修士會(喇沙會)的人正是聖約翰喇沙。聖約翰喇沙一生致力為窮人提供教育，以改變當時權貴子弟獨佔教育資源的局面，使不同界別的兒童都能得到基礎教育。

而為了紀念2019年聖約翰喇沙逝世三百周年，香港喇沙會為此舉行一連串紀念活動，主題為「一心一意、一份承諾、一生一世」。強調無論我們的背景如何，都是同一個團體，都為了共同的利益而共同努力，同時代表聖約翰喇沙充實的生活和展現喇沙會在世界上八十個國家及地區的活力，對此香港喇沙會邀請我校師生一同參與活動。

彌撒的預備工作

參與籌備工作的同學們為求彌撒過程完美無瑕，不但在星期五放學校後綵排多達兩小時，於彌撒當天更比所有人更早到達，為求綵排多一兩次，期望在所有參與者面前表現到最好的一面。他們在綵排的過程中有辛苦的時候，但是他們卻對能夠參與這個盛大的聚會感到榮幸，既見證喇沙會的歷史，同時成為這個歷史的一小部分。

彌撒開始

在彌撒開始前，校長及數十名師生亦已到達喇沙小學準備接受心靈的洗滌，見證歷史。隨著彌撒的開始，身穿黑袍和白袍的神父和修士步進禮堂，全場頓時莊嚴寂靜無聲，靜心地參與這場意義非凡的彌撒。

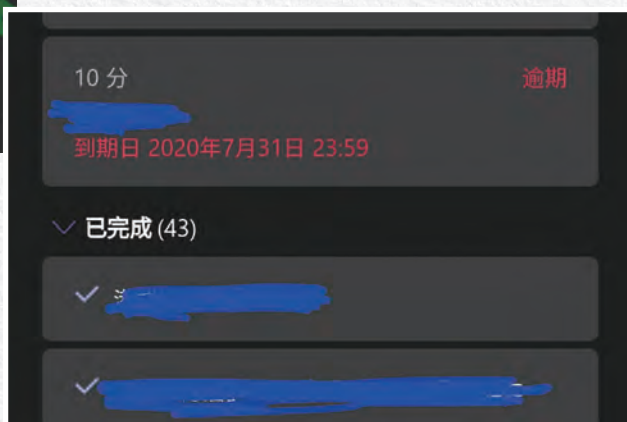
網課的苦與樂

中庸之道與現代社會

所謂「中庸之道」的「中庸」是孔子思想方法的核心。其中「中」指的是「不偏」，「庸」指的是「不改」，而「中庸」就是指「中和恆常」的意思，也就是適度、合乎中道的方法。

那在現實當中我們能否做到中庸之道的處事態度呢？

首先，社會的基本組成體是個人，要有人和社會方能和諧。一個人的價值不應是你擁有多少財富，而應是你為這個社會或者他人付出了多少！所以作為社會的個體，我們應該為社會或他人付出一部分自己的力量或汗水，做一個於國、於社會、於他人有用的人，為社會的和諧盡自己的義務。

在處理個人與他人或個人與社會的利益時，從儒家思想遵循「中道」原則，要求皆以雙方為重，不能偏執某一方，而是要雙方的利益都兼顧。不能過分強調社會利益，忽視個人利益，或者過分強調個人利益，而忽視社會利益。處理問題時，就要視情況的變化而變化，如果國家在危難當中，則應以國家的利益為重。總之，時時、事事、處處盡量做到恰到好处、無過無不及，在變化中掌握好「度」，凡事既不太過，也不能不及。

選擇中庸處世處事，對待事物要學會與時俱進，依據事物具體的發展規律變化來處理問題。《中庸》中的“君子之中庸也，君子而時中”，就是要求我們在不同的境遇，時刻保持恰當、中庸的處理方法。社會中找到適合社會發展的中庸之道，就可以建設一個美滿和諧的社會。

當代社會高速發展，全社會普遍受到了工業和都市化的衝擊，這種衝擊造成許多人的心態失衡，在這種社會時態勢下，儒家的中庸之道可以起到調節人際關係的作用。因此，我個人認為中庸之道的處事態度是十分的適用於現代社會。

Pope Francis - Angelus

Saint Peter's Square

Sunday, 6 June 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today, in Italy and in other countries, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Gospel presents us the narrative of the Last Supper (Mk 14:12-16, 22-26). The words and gestures of the Lord touch our hearts: He takes the bread in his hands, pronounces the blessing, breaks it and offers it to the disciples, saying: "Take; this is my body" (v. 22).

And thus, with simplicity, Jesus gives us the greatest sacrament. His is a humble gesture of giving, a gesture of sharing. At the culmination of his life, he does not distribute an abundance of bread to feed the multitudes, but breaks himself apart at the Passover supper with the disciples. In this way Jesus shows us that the aim of life lies in self-giving, that the greatest thing is to serve. And today once more we find the greatness of God in a piece of Bread, in a fragility that overflows with love, that overflows with sharing. Fragility is precisely the word I would like to underscore. Jesus becomes fragile like the bread that is broken and crumbled. But his strength lies precisely therein, in his fragility. In the Eucharist fragility is strength: the strength of the love that becomes small so it can be welcomed and not feared; the strength of the love that is broken and shared so as to nourish and give life; the strength of the love that is split apart so as to join all of us in unity.

And there is another strength that stands out in the fragility of the Eucharist: the strength to love those who make mistakes. It is on the night he is betrayed that Jesus gives us the Bread of Life. He gives us the greatest gift while he feels the deepest abyss in his heart: the disciple who eats with Him, who dips the morsel in the same plate, is betraying Him. And betrayal is the worst suffering for one who loves. And what does Jesus do? He reacts to the evil with a greater good. He responds to Judas' 'no' with the 'yes' of mercy. He does not punish the sinner, but rather gives His life for him; He pays for him. When we receive the Eucharist, Jesus does the same with us: he knows us; he knows we are sinners; and he knows we make many mistakes, but he does not give up on joining his life to ours. He knows that we need it, because the Eucharist is not the reward of saints,



no, it is the Bread of sinners. This is why he exhorts us: “Do not be afraid! Take and eat”.

Each time we receive the Bread of Life, Jesus comes to give new meaning to our fragilities. He reminds us that in his eyes we are more precious than we think. He tells us he is pleased if we share our fragilities with him. He repeats to us that his mercy is not afraid of our miseries. The mercy of Jesus is not afraid of our miseries. And above all he heals us from those fragilities that we cannot heal

on our own, with love. What fragilities? Let's think. That of feeling resentment toward those who have done us harm — we cannot heal from this on our own; that of distancing ourselves from others and closing off within ourselves — we cannot heal from that on our own; that of feeling sorry for ourselves and complaining without finding peace; from this too, we cannot heal on our own. It is He who heals us with his presence, with his bread, with the Eucharist. The Eucharist is an effective medicine for these closures. The Bread of Life, in fact, heals rigidity and transforms it into docility. The Eucharist heals because it unites with Jesus: it makes us assimilate his way of living, his ability to break himself apart and give himself to brothers and sisters, to respond to evil with good. He gives us the courage to go outside of ourselves and bend down with love toward the fragility of others. As God does with us. This is the logic of the Eucharist: we receive Jesus who loves us and heals our fragilities in order to love others and help them in their fragilities; and this lasts our entire life. In the Liturgy of the Hours today, we prayed a hymn: four verses that are the summary of Jesus' entire life. And they tell us this: as Jesus was born, he became our travelling companion in life. Then, at the supper he gave himself as food. Then, on the cross, in his death, he became the “price”; he paid for us. And now, as he reigns in Heaven he is our reward; we go to seek the One who awaits us [cf. Hymn at Lauds on Corpus Christi, *Verbum Supernum Prodiens*].

May the Blessed Virgin, in whom God became flesh, help us to embrace the Eucharist with a grateful heart and to make a gift of our life too. May the Eucharist make us a gift for all others.

Supervisor's Message



The Covid-19 pandemic continues to affect everyone in society this year. The 2020-2021 school year is the second consecutive year that we have seen disrupted classes and eventually a mixed mode of online classes and face-to-face classes implemented throughout the year.

With the experience of last year's impact, we are more ready to deal with the interruption this time. With generally lower numbers of infected cases and availability of vaccines, students from alternate forms were able to attend face-to-face classes. All classes were arranged into either a morning or afternoon session in order to avoid lunchtime chaos.

Almost all inter-class and inter-school events were at a standstill this year, again, including our annual Athletics Meet and Swimming Gala. It was a pity that our students were not able to flex their muscles at the competitions. Only a handful of events were successfully held during the year. Yung Chak Fai of 5D, for example, received the Silver Medal (Senior Group) in the Hong Kong Olympiad in Informatics 2020/21.

Our students now have a modern and practical study space for studying and referencing. The old boys group want to thank the De La Salle Brothers, who have dedicated themselves to the mission of Christian education,

therefore they named the new library "the De La Salle Brothers" Library.

Liberal Studies for senior form students, which was implemented from 2009, is being reformed into another subject in the next school year. There are other reforms to other subjects in the coming year and we have yet to see the impact on the studies of those subjects.

The Form Six Graduation Ceremony was held in the school hall on July 5th in a concise manner. Brother Dennis, the new Director of Hong Kong Lasallian Family, gave the graduating students an encouraging and enlightening farewell speech. I wish every graduate a bright future no matter which path forward they choose to pursue.

The CSK PTA, headed by Mr Alan Chan and Cynthia So, endeavoured to provide regular activities and communications with all the members during these difficult times. We all appreciate that we have a team of hard-working committee members and volunteers.

This is the time to say goodbye to those teachers who are retiring at the end of this school year. Ms Serena Leung, our vice principal, and Mr KK Lam, are both retiring. I wish them a healthy and joyful retirement time.

Principal's Message

The COVID-19 pandemic has continued to interrupt classes and school activities. We all miss many of our CSK traditions. The Swimming Gala, Athletics Meet, and inter-class as well as inter-school competitions were all suspended. Nonetheless, we have had to cope with the pandemic and continue our teaching and learning.

We have enhanced our remote learning by adapting classroom resources for online classes through Microsoft Teams and OneNote. We have also done our best to maintain school routines and a positive learning environment by engaging with our students online. To enhance curriculum development and staff professional development, we enrolled in support programmes provided by the Education Bureau as well as the University of Hong Kong. The subject areas include Chinese Language, Mathematics, and Science Education. With the generous donations from Dr. Felix Yip and other Old Boys, the library development project was brought to life. Starting in the summer of 2020, the renovation work was completed in April 2021. The new library is named “De La Salle Brothers Library” to honour the commitment and devotion of the Brothers who served



at CSK. The new school library facilitates students' inquiry and information skills by supplying computer workstations, mobile devices and other socializing features requested by our students. It provides students with both an appreciation of literature and an aptitude in modern technology, encouraging lifelong learning and reading.

The school has also renovated the canteen area, turning it into a multi-purpose area. The area is now equipped with computer facilities as well as an air-conditioning system. It is certainly a good place for students' activities and assemblies. The renovation work has revealed a part of the school building which is still in its original state – a fair-faced concrete wall. Flashing back to 1969, the school building was finished fair-faced, both externally and internally. Columns and beams showed the moulding of narrow boards of rough wood. Concrete infilling blocks were also left fair-faced. The untouched wall will be preserved as a crucial testament to CSK's heritage.

In closing, I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to Mr. HT Tang and other members of the Editorial Board for their perseverance in making this publication possible during the COVID-19 pandemic.

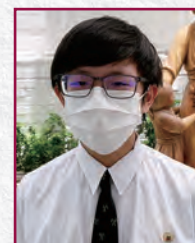

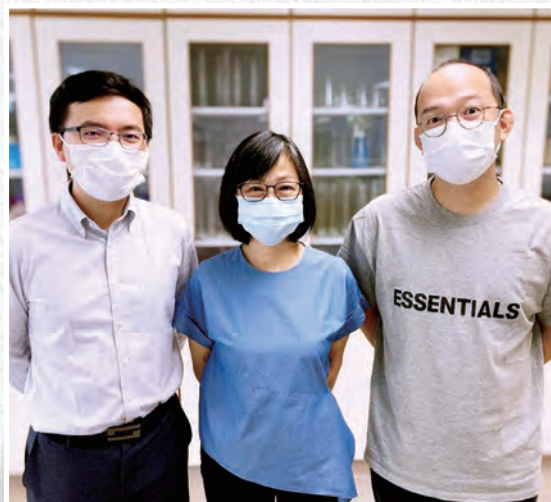

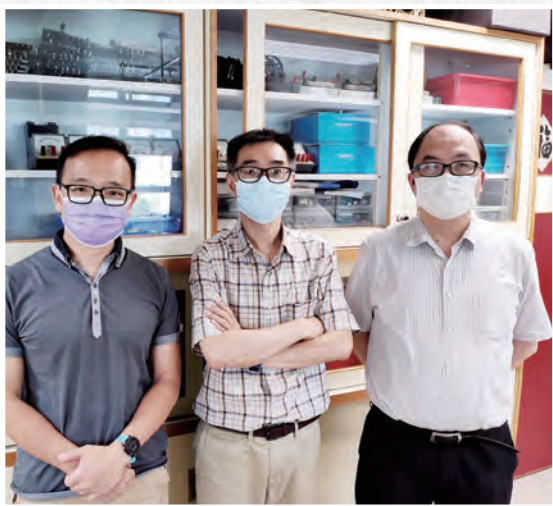

Speech Day 2021

Speech by REV. Brother Dennis Magbanua FSC

Director of the Brothers Community of St. Joseph's College

School Supervisor Mr Chris LAU, members of the CSK College IMC, my La Salle Brother, Mikey, school principal Mr. LEE, parents, teachers, guests, dear students,

In preparing this message, I contemplated on how the school has been effectively realizing the Lasallian Mission in this school. CSK's mission is clearly stated in our Mission Statement which goes:

The mission of the school is to provide a human and Christian education for the young —

“The school is committed to forming a community which puts the highest human and Christian values within reach of students so that they can become people with integrity and with an eagerness to serve others.”

Big words we have here: People with integrity who are eager to serve others.

Tonight, I urge you always to remember these two words: Integrity and Service and live the set of guidelines that has been taught to you since you began your schooling in CSK.

Let me begin with the second word: “Service.” How can a CSK Old Boy make real the word “Service” in his life? Service is a call for you to love tenderly. Love is the highest of all values and where you should base all your actions. Love moves you to serve others and to take care of Mother Nature.

The second call of “Service” is for you to act justly. When you base your actions on love, you will act justly, and you will know that you cannot take the law into your own hands.

Now we go back to the first word: Integrity. How can a CSK Old Boy make real the word “Integrity” in his life? Integrity is a call for you to walk humbly with God. Humility leads

us to deepen our sense of integrity.

In all we do, let us always think that it is not by our power that

we can love and live a just life. It is God who gives us the grace to become a better version of ourselves. In the Catholic tradition, it is the Christ-God who humbled himself and took the form of a human being so that he can journey with us in the building of a humane and just kingdom here on earth.

Let me repeat these three: Love tenderly, and Walk humbly with God

It will be easier for you to remember these three, if you take note of the first letter of each sentence. L for Love tenderly, A for Act justly, W for Walk humbly with God

The three letters spell out the word LAW.

This is God's Law that we should abide by as Old Boys, everyday of our lives.

I still consider myself as a new arrival in Hong Kong. I have been residing in Hong Kong for just over one year. I have grown to love Hong Kong a lot and have found it to be beautiful. One of my favorite things to do is to look at the full moon on certain days of the month, because there are many clear nights here. Every time I look at the full moon, I am reminded of a beautiful story. It is a story that I would like to share with you tonight. I hope that you will remember this story every time there is a full moon. Before I begin, let me tell you that the next full moon is on Sing Kei Lok on the 24th of July.

There is this folklore, an old story - it is supposedly from Japan.

Many years ago, there was an old man who lived on the moon, who, from my perspective, was probably a representation of God. He looked down towards the earth to



see if indeed there were kind animals in the forest. He wanted to find out which of the animals was the kindest of them all. Thus, he began his quest by going down from the moon to the earth and then to the forest.

On that particular night, he humbled himself and pretended to be a hungry, old, and dying beggar so he can find out if the animals in the forest will help him by giving him food.

Luckily an owl saw him suffering.

In haste, the owl gathered all the animals in the forest and instructed them to find food for the hungry, old and dying man. All the animals dashed away to fetch food for him.

Sometime later, the first to return was the monkey.

The monkey offered the hungry old man some bananas. The old man thanked the monkey and ate the bananas. Now, he wasn't as hungry anymore.

The second to arrive was the dove.

The dove brought him grapes. The old man thanked the dove and ate the grapes. He now felt much better.

A few hours later, most of the forest animals returned and offered the old man the food they brought.

The last to arrive was the rabbit.

The rabbit was not only the last, but also, he did not bring any food with him. One could see tears rolling down from his eyes for this failure.

Life under COVID-19

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, some changes have been applied to our school lives. The obvious one being that everyone has to wear a mask. Other than that, we also have to check our body temperature and sanitize our hands before entering the school campus.

Some changes have also affected our time table. We keep all of our lessons but each lesson is now cut short by 5 minutes and our lunch break has become a second 15-minute recess. Classes now end at 1:20 pm and we can have lunch after school. However, the canteen will not serve lunch. In fact, the canteen no longer sells any form of food and only sells beverages. This is due to concerns of food contamination and the effort to minimize the time that students remove their masks.

Speaking of the canteen, the old tables have been replaced with smaller tables for two, and each table is separated down the middle by a piece of clear plastic. In my opinion, the canteen looks a lot better with these tables so I hope they're here to stay even after the pandemic is over.

However, the capacity of the canteen is now lower due to the new tables. So, the covered playground is now filled with well-spaced chairs to prevent students from congregating in clutters before school. The school hall is also open before class for students to enjoy an air-conditioned rest before school starts.

To avoid huge crowds, the morning assembly has been canceled, which I'm sure a lot of students are very happy about. Standing in the middle of the playground for 15 minutes on a hot summer's day is not exactly pleasant.



The morning prayer is now done in the classrooms and announcements from the school office are passed on by form teachers.

When the pandemic became too serious and in-person lessons were suspended by the Education Bureau, had online lessons using Microsoft Teams. The online lessons followed the same revised time table but 5 additional minutes were cut from each lesson so each lesson was only 30 minutes long. In stead 5 minute gaps were added between each lesson to allow teachers to rotate between classrooms. There hasn't been a lack of bloopers in online classes. For example, students would frequently forget to turn off their mics, and sometimes teachers would speak for minutes before realizing that they hadn't turn their microphones on.

Overall, there has been quite a few changes that we have had to cope with. But everyone has done a great job working with what we have.

P.S. The Civil Service Bureau approved the outreach vaccination service for CSK students. On 30/07/21, students received the 1st dose of Biontech vaccine at Wa Ying College, and they received the second dose on 20/08/21

An Interview with Brother Michael



Q1: What do you think about the students in CSK and do you enjoy your time here?

I officially started teaching in CSK this school year but I have been going around and working here in Hong Kong for 2 years already. And I find the students in CSK very hard working especially the form 1 students that I am teaching. They try to do their best and they come from different schools, and for them to be able to work together and get to know one another in this school year (a very special year), they are very resilient and were able to adjust to the policies of the school and CSK school life. Some of them, I see, have talents and skills and I am happy to see them here in CSK to discover and develop their full potentials.

Q2: In which countries have you done missionary work as a brother? And are there any interesting stories that you can share with us?

I have been a brother for 12 years and I was assigned to several big schools in the Philippines including mission schools which cater to the poor and help them out by giving them a lot of scholarships. Coming to Hong Kong is my first assignment outside of the Philippines, my home country. The interesting thing I can share is I have so many roles in school like a subject teacher, a club moderator, a class advisor and, in this case, a form teacher. I worked as a school officer, manager, and in many more different roles. Because as a brother, we experience all of those roles. Among these, I guess the role that I enjoyed the most is being just a brother. Getting to interact with students, with fellow teachers, helping anyone who is in need in the school, that's the most enjoyable part of me being a brother, just being myself for everyone in the school.

Q3: What is the reason that you chose to become a brother?

When I was young, aiming for the university, 1 thing struck me and I realized something. We grow up, study, work, have family and kids, the cycle goes on and on. And I say: is there something else in life outside this cycle. And so I started searching. Then I realized I find great joy and fulfillment in helping others, especially those who are in need. That's something money can't buy. Eventually I met the brothers in the Lasallian university and I realize that the work they are doing mostly for schools is one way of helping the poor and those who are in need as education is the solution to get people out of the vicious cycle of poverty. After I graduated from university, I joined the brothers and the rest is history.

**Q4: What is the most rewarding moment in your career as a brother?**

It is when I see my students have learnt something from me. They apply what they have learned, and it makes me feel that I have already done my part and gives me much satisfaction.

Q5: Due to COVID-19, face-to-face activities in school were very limited. I would like to ask how were religious activities conducted during these times?

It is very unfortunate that this pandemic happened. It is a lot of hustling because we went into these virtual, online classes and meetings. We are living in an age where technology is present and available for us. Imagine this happening 50 years ago, schools would definitely have stopped, students wouldn't have got to learn anything. But now technology has given us this option to communicate with one another virtually. While it cannot be compared with in-person interactions, it's the most we can do at this moment. In regards to religious activities, it has become limited as well. Most of them are online like the Christmas prayer service and the Founder's Day prayer service. Those are some of the activities that were pre-recorded and shown online.

Q6: Do you think the number of religious activities conducted in CSK is enough or not? And do you think more religious activities should be conducted next year?

We have quite a number of activities like regular masses, visits to churches, interactions with other schools in 2019 but because of the pandemic, many of them were cancelled. Hopefully these activities can be resumed in the next school year. I do hope that the next year can be back to normal. And I'm sure once we are allowed to do have all of these activities again, we will do all of these activities or even more. So I'm looking forward to having a normal school year.

Q7: Which is the most memorable religious activity you have conducted in CSK or participated in this year?

I guess it's the Christmas prayer service because I got to share the message of what Christmas really means and I hope all of those who watched the whole prayer service remember the real reason for the season, which is Jesus Christ.

Q8: What do you think the students of CSK can do in order to strengthen their faith in God?

I think students should keep on building that relationship. How? It's basically how you build a relationship with your friends and your family members. You spend time with one another. The same goes with how you build a relationship with God and strengthen your bond with God.

An Interview with Mrs. Betsy Chan



In May 2021, the School Magazine had an interview with Mrs B Chan who has recently retired from her teaching post in our school.

Mrs B Chan has taught in Chan Sui Ki (La Salle) College for the past thirty-eight years. Teaching in CSK was her first and her last job. She told our editors that there was no special reason why she chose to teach in this school and that it was simply because this school was the first one to offer her a contract when she was seeking a job opportunity after graduating from the university. For the

reason of interest, she worked continuously in this school until retirement. She said that she treasured every moment she had with her colleagues and her students. She also had a 'memorable' experience while working here: she was the only person in this school who was trapped in both the old lift and the new one. What an experience!

Apart from being a teacher of English Language, Mrs Chan also taught EPA (Economics and Public Affairs) and Geography many years ago as teachers of English generally had to teach other subjects in the past. She has been the chairperson of the English department since 1991 until two years before retirement. She has also worked as the Prefect of Studies.

When asked about her impression of CSK students, Mrs Chan described them as being very cheerful and energetic. However, quite a number of them do not care about their academic performance. On the whole, CSK students always show a great sense of belonging to the school in important events like the Inter-school Athletics Meet and other inter-school functions.

As for advice to current CSK students, Mrs Chan emphasizes the need to manage time more efficiently because many students now spend too much time playing mobile games and surfing the Internet. In many cases, some of them surf the Internet until midnight and as a result, they feel fatigued during lessons the next day. Moreover, students should be attentive



during lessons, complete all assignments and do revision before allotting some time to leisure activities. However, students nowadays lead a very busy life as many of them have to engage themselves in a lot of extra-curricular activities as well as attend private tutorial lessons. They have to travel to different places for such purposes and so lose precious time for a good rest.

Mrs Chan also told us that she was good at English writing when she was a student. Speaking of the times when she was a student, there were many chances for students to learn English because of the existence of a rich language learning environment. They could listen to much more English songs and watch more English films. Actually, dubbing for English movies was not a usual practice. The audience could only hear dialogues in English and refer to the Chinese subtitles provided when necessary. At school, students were also required to use English for learning and communication daily. Apparently, that was an effective way to learn English. Although things have changed a lot all through these years, Mrs Chan believes that a positive attitude towards learning is always the key to success. It is not difficult to learn English in our daily life. In fact, learning English is not a problem even if the language environment is not that rich nowadays. As an example, one can choose to watch more English language movies instead of Chinese ones if one wants to improve one's listening skills. Students need to expose themselves to English more frequently if they want improvement. They should remember to make an effort and practise more.

When comparing past and present students in our school, Mrs Chan remarked that students were very diligent when there were still two public examinations, namely, the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination and the Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination because competition was keen at that time and chances to get admitted to university were slim. In those days, a university degree could really guarantee a decent job. However, the situation nowadays is different since there are always choices and chances for further education.

According to Mrs Chan, it is always essential for students to strike a balance between study and play, but many of them fail to do so. She claims that studying should be the most important task for students, but acquiring knowledge from textbooks only is not enough. Students should participate in some but not too many activities in order to widen their social circle and develop personal interest. They should never do too many things at one time as it is very likely that they can never excel in one. For example, for a student who is very weak academically but very good at basketball, Mrs Chan suggests that he should not give up his study all for basketball. He should spare time for his study and try harder to get better grades instead. After he has completed his secondary education, he can then focus on what he loves to do. She believes that time and effort can definitely improve one's academic performance.

Now Mrs Chan wants to take a rest first. She has thought about doing some voluntary work such as being a guide dog trainer and teaching newly immigrated children English, but she has not made any decision yet. It is a fun fact that she knits in her spare time.

Finally, Mrs Chan encourages us to work more diligently during our course of study. In this way, we will not have any regret even if we cannot get good results in the HKDSE. We should also remember the words 'brave', 'fearless', 'true' and 'kind' in the lyrics of our school song since they remind us of how to be a good person. She also hopes that we can all treasure every moment of our life in CSK.

An Interview with Ms. Y M Lee

Many of you may think she will be the vice principal responsible for the academic area, she also shared the same thought before I interviewed her. However, she will be in charge of the pastoral division.

Many CSK boys agree that curriculum development is what Ms. Lee is good at. Then, why is she in charge of the pastoral division? She stated that she wanted to have a closer relationship with students. In fact, Ms. Lee had plenty of experience in counselling and career guidance in the past. However, after working in CSK, she concentrated on curriculum development. A few years ago, she was invited to work in the Education Bureau. Her department works in the area of catching for learner diversity. She learned some skills to better at classroom teaching. Also she got the chance to visit many schools and gained by sharing with other teachers. Thus, she was satisfied with her work on the academic side wanted to make some significant change with challenges. As a result, she chose to become the vice principal to contribute to CSK in other aspects.

Talking about students nowadays, Ms. Lee think that today's students lack the motivation to improve. They are happy with what they have and are in the habit of getting better results without hard work. Sometimes, Ms. Lee is disappointed that students give a lot of excuses when they fail. Neglecting the downside, Ms. Lee still agrees that it is an inevitable process to become a mature person. She firmly believes that boys of CSK are

smart, whether they can improve depends on whether students are willing to develop their potentials. She had some advice for us.

Firstly, students should broaden their horizons. Hong Kong students are being criticized for having no vision as their world is too small. Ms. Lee emphasized that having a wider exposure will let students understand clearly about what they are doing, and thus they can set a target, a strong goal, and work hard for it. Moreover, a goal bridges you to Hong Kong society as you know more about it. It is essential in this era as there are many opportunities and challenges.

"You can have brilliant ideas but if you can't get them across, your ideas won't get you anywhere."

Secondly, students should enhance their communication and presentation skills. For



communication skills, when we are facing opposing ideas, we should learn how to reject them and respond politely. As we are boys, we must equip ourselves with better soft skills. Even apologizing to others is a difficult matter. Ms. Lee quotes an example of how students lack soft skills, when using instant messengers nowadays. Ms Lee found that some students won't give any responses after receiving messages. In your stance, you may not regard this as a problem. But, Ms. Lee claimed that this was a little bit impolite. Giving a reply after reading a message is not only a matter of politeness, but also a way to let the sender know you have understood the message. That shows your respect to each other. That is crucial in communication. For presentation skills, it is important to have good communication skills. It allows your listener to grasp your ideas, giving them a good impression, identifying the importance of yourselves within a group.

"The process is the most important part of the journey. Appreciate it while you have it."

Thirdly, you should enjoy what you are doing. When you are engaged in an activity, you won't force yourself to achieve a certain result. You need to have a sense of looking forward to something, just like Ms. Lee. She enjoyed going to school when she was studying, having great expectations on what she would learn. If an event is not your cup of tea, you won't have motivation to work hard for it. It won't turn out great. Life is a continuous process. The adversities you are facing now are only a snapshot in your life. Ms. Lee says if you want to attain more in life, you must enjoy the process. If you want to improve your academic results, you should enjoy the learning process, but not treat your studies as drudgery. Develop your interests in learning. Nobody is born a scholar.

Many of you might have heard that Ms. Lee will not train the debate team anymore. Many debaters want to be pushed to their limits by Ms. Lee. She clarified that she is not quitting the debate team. However, it is obvious that training a debate team requires a lot of time, she might not have enough spare time next year and she is afraid that it will drag the team down. Debate training duties have been passed over to Ms. HK Wong, who is in charge the senior team. Ms. Lee and Mr. Taylor, who is in charging the junior team will help senior boys who join the Sing Tao Debating competition.

Mahatma Gandhi said, "The future depends on what we do in the present".

In 5 years, our form 5 students will enter society. In 6 years, our form 4 students will enter society. What do you think you will be in ten years? A cook in McDonald's or an accountant, a dentist? That isn't far away. Once we are in senior form, the game of DSE will have started. We need to equip ourselves with skills to fulfill our dreams

As this year is still affected by COVID-19, Ms. Lee doesn't have a lot of chances to see students.

Life in Hong Kong is stressful. I hope under the leadership of Ms. Lee, students will transform their pressure into motivation.

Advice to CSK boys

Mr Chan talks about the attitude of studying. He claims that it is essential to be humble while studying. 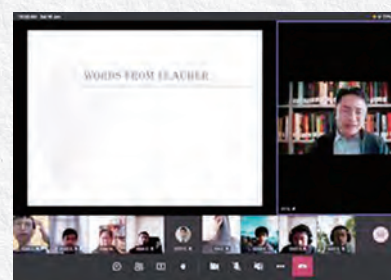
Christmas Prayer Service & Celebration

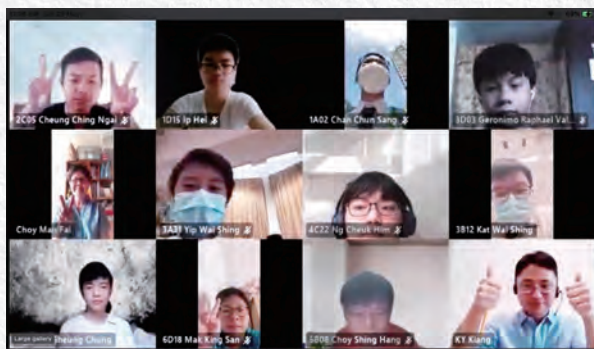


Founder's Week 2021

舊生莫偉光先生專訪

背景

莫偉光先生是陳瑞祺（喇沙）書院一九七七至一九七八年度的畢業生。畢業至今已有43年。



學校獨特之處

被問到在陳瑞祺就讀時認為學校有甚麼獨特之處，莫偉光師兄認為當時的同學向心力強。莫師兄形容當時的校長于真修士給予學生很大自由度，鼓勵學生嘗試不同的事物，在老師們的基本指導下學生有很大的發揮空間。

發揮空間

談到發揮空間，莫師兄回憶起一段特別的經歷。莫師兄曾參與香港愛丁堡公爵獎勵計劃（現為香港青年獎勵計劃）的遠足活動，是中學生涯中一段驚險而精彩的經歷。當時莫師兄與幾位同學一同遠足，雖然同行老師判斷繼續前行可能會迷失方向，但依然讓同學自己決定，結果一行人在小森林中迷路，靠老師出發前教導使用的野外求生工具向附近居民求救，最後由直升機送往警署借宿一夜。多年中學生涯中莫師兄其中一個最深刻的印象是翌日他們向校長報告迷路事件時校長的態度。當時校長得知此事後沒有半句責怪，只是關心學生有沒有受傷，又詢問他們餓不餓，知道學生們安然無恙後更笑說「下次再坐直升機」，鼓勵學生下次繼續努力。此段經歷讓莫師兄感受到校長老師給予學生很大的自由空間發



揮。莫師兄認為老師只要判斷到處於學生在安全的情況下，便不會干預學生的決定，容許學生自由探索。

與同學之間的互動

莫師兄在陳瑞祺就讀時同學之間的互動很強，會互相幫助。莫師兄認為當時公開考試對學生帶來壓力，不努力讀書便會被淘汰，難以繼續求學。以人數說明，當時與莫師兄一同修讀的三班理科學生約有一百四十人，最終只有不超過五十人原校升讀預科課程，競爭激烈。在現今世代充裕的大學學位下，已很難體驗到當時求學的辛酸。

前體育科主任黃德誠老師專訪



黃老師的讀書時期

黃老師對陳瑞祺（喇沙）書院的第一印象是自由，他在中一入學時覺得校舍很大。那時普遍同學都很喜歡上體育課，下課後也會很活躍去打球，籃球場、足球場幾乎全部爆滿，午飯時間亦會上紅燈山即昔日的網球場旁邊踢球。很早期他們已經參加齊七項的校際運動比賽，包括游泳、田徑、乒乓球、羽毛球、籃球、足球等，幾乎從開校首幾年已經有參加了，而且每年都有參加。黃老師指出當時學生的體育成績已經很卓越了。

以不同身份重踏校園

黃老師指早期由學生變老師身份進入陳瑞祺時的分別不大，同學們都十分積極參與體育運動。但最近十年，同學的參與程度及積極性都明顯下降，可能有其他的愛好，或是怕辛苦。以前的學生明顯有不屈不撓的精神，但現時同學則比較容易因為辛苦而放棄。

任內難忘的回憶

黃老師在運動方面有很多難忘回憶，其中有一次學界越野賽第一組奪得冠軍，因為這是由他讀書時期開始的很多同學的心願，直到1989年才有了第一次的第一組的冠軍。

另外在學校的二十周年時，學校的老師和同學一起去了廣東新會參觀其中一間中學及去了澳門參觀另外一間中學，都是陳氏家族贊助的學校，一共有十多位老師及同學前行，大家一起打球，是一次很難忘的經歷。

對於後期一點的難忘回憶，他想是開了新高中的體育科，因為一向體育給人的感覺都是玩樂、實習為多，但新高中體育科的考試包括了理論及實習，他想是一個比較新穎的嘗試。

在私底下的難忘回憶，也是以早期的居多。因為早期進來教學的時候年齡與同學相差不大，雖然輩分上是老師，但下課後就好像大哥哥，例如早期練習越野跑的時候，除了在學校練習，他們也會出外練習，他們會坐車到西貢北潭凹，然後跑入大浪灣沙灘踢球、食飯，然後又跑回出來。又很多時比賽後會去唱卡拉OK，這些都是印象非常深刻的回憶。很多不論是早期、近期的學生，黃老師和他們都有來往和接觸，他們也經常來找黃老師，有時晚上跑步也會與一些舊生一起跑。大家的感情都很深厚。

拍影片教體育

其實黃老師很早已經有做網上教學的工作，大概1997、98年左右已經開始，除了體育，他把電腦科的內容做成教材，因為早期電腦科全港都沒有教科書，教育局也只有少部份的教材，單靠這些教學是非常不足夠的。所以當時他也嘗試做一些工作紙、教學材料等，然後放上網，除了方便我校的同學外，其實外面的同學反而用得更多，因為當時學界沒有這些東西，甚至教育城也有問他可不可以將他的教材上載教育城網供其他人分享，黃老師當然很樂意。因此當時做電腦的比體育的還多，同時製作網頁的時候也會把體育科的也放上去，當時多媒體的科技未成熟，所以一般也只是以文字、圖片為主，也有嘗試透過多媒體介紹體育方面的知識，但當時自己同學反而看得少，主要是外面有考體育科會考的同學和教育廳學院的體育科同學為多。現在他仍然有體育科的網站，但對像同樣也以外面的同學居多。

其他人對於黃老師的教材的評價與讚好

黃老師其實很少可以直接與他們溝通，很多時都是透過外面的運動員，例如教育學院的體育老師，從他們口中，甚至浸大畢業的林老師都有提到：很多人都有看黃老師的網頁，作準備功課及應付考試之用，也有從其他學校的體育老師知道教材的評價，因為黃老師有時與他們上課的時候見面，大家也有談到準備教學材料的話題。

與學生保持良好師生關係

黃老師喜歡與同學溝通和接觸。很遺憾這十幾年工作多了，能夠下課與同學接觸的時間少之又少，相比初進來時候，早期與同學的感情更為深厚，因為除了上課的時候，放學後他們也會一起練習，練習不單只跑，還有聊天的時間，不論是自己家裏的事，甚至感情方面都有聊到，所以當時都可以為同學解答到很多問題，幫到他們很多。但後來因為教育改革，愈來愈多文件工作，後來

又因為升職等因素，要做的工作也愈來愈多，加上體育科人手只有幾個，時間都用在盡量應付所有的政府文件及報告上了。除了球類活動有帶隊老師，例如馬老師、蕭老師的幫助外，其他的運動校隊都是由他負責，所以每到學界比賽的時間(每年的10至11月)，他都十分之忙碌。希望其他的體育老師能夠投放多些時間於準備課堂或放學後的時間與同學一起練習，這樣能盡最大的人手與同學相處。環看近十多年，與同學的感情培養始終不及以前的深厚。

2003年沙士及2019年新冠病毒對體育科的挑戰

這一次的挑戰，黃老師覺得是為期很長，沙士的時候只有一至兩個月，但這次當初他估計約有一年的時間，但結果比想像中更加壞。這次體育科最大的挑戰是究竟應如何正常地進行實踐，因為體育是個實習性很強的科目，單靠網上課堂其實不能做什麼，因為除了體育選修科的同學可以認識一下體育知識外，其他同學又好像沒有這些需要。在學校開始網上教學的時候，他在體育選修科上選一些體育知識作為教學材料，不論是否熱衷於體育的同學，他希望在他們人生上，無論健康、體適能方面都有所得益。雖然透過網上形式，未必所有同學都認真聆聽，但他認為盡量能做就做，既然影片已經上載給同學，希望他們有需要的時候可以用。之後復課又不太建議有實體的體育科，只能做一些體能活動，但同學的體能未必可連續上兩堂體育課，所以安排課程也很傷腦筋，他和另外一位黃老師也花了很多心血構思不同的教材。幸好現在可以作有限度的實體體育課，但場地問題也是另一挑戰，因為帶太多同學出外上課仍有限制。

體育科的其他挑戰

黃老師認為最大挑戰是文憑試，當同學去到中五、中六，學生為了應付公開試而很難進行練習。早期有中七，所以中五、中六、中七都是甲組，中七同學因應付



考試而離隊，問題亦不大，但現時文憑試，中五的同學已經開始擔心校隊練習對他們的影響很大，變相甲組中五、中六的同學都開始不出席練習，甚至離開校隊，令高年級校隊人數愈來愈少。加上很多年前學校參加了優化班級計畫，每一級由5班變成4班，這個影響也是非常之大，所以參與度會下跌，成績也自然會差了。所以很多學校都只是集中於一個項目，以保持該項目的競爭水平，但他覺得如以同學得益的角度來說，這樣做似乎十分可惜，因學校傳統以來同學也很喜歡運動，如只是為了爭取學界運動好成績而削減其他運動項目，會剝奪很多同學運動的機會，所以他們體育部的同事也不太想這樣做，他們也盡量保持辦齊七項運動校隊，希望盡量保留傳統，令同學有更多機會參與運動。

33年教育生涯的心得和對未來體育科的希望

黃老師希望學校的體育成績能比之前更加好，包括文憑試及學界成績，運動上也希望有以前輝煌的景象，但希望還希望，在實際人力資源及同學投入方面都要改善。例如初時長跑隊有些同學連鞋都沒有，只是穿“白飯魚”白布鞋跑步，對於每日練習的同學來說其實十分傷腳，幸好金錢資源上充足，能夠為他們買一雙跑鞋。後來成績不錯，他也找了不少舊生幫忙贊助，所以這方面資源十分充足。但最大問題是同學的參與及人力資源，不知是否太擔心文憑試的成績，高年級的同學很難出席所有的練習，這真是兩難。

退休後向身邊的人繼續傳授體育精神

黃老師會繼續製作網頁，有時也會與舊生一起跑步，加上他經常會回來學校，一定會繼續向身邊的人傳授陳瑞祺的體育精神。

目前為止疫情都持續了一段時間，所有運動項目都停止了。疫情前我都一直很享受與學生練習的時間，不論早上或是放學後會與中六的學生練習，但這也只是少部分而已，在網上都有不同的練習，不過只有幾個學生出席。雖然疫情影響了不少，但我也很享受這樣的生活。工作中的苦與樂視乎你如何看待，我並不會把工作當中的不快看待為苦事，大部分都是樂事。

工作或學生的期望：

只要同學能努力付出，我對他們的期望也會越高

工作期望有兩方面：一，學生能否在陳瑞祺運動課上得到不同的知識。坦白講，現在運動課的知識層面並不廣闊，希望學生能在未來擴闊自己的視野，尤其在體育方面；二，希望學生能為陳瑞祺拉高文憑試體育成績，只要同學能努力付出，我對他們的期望也會越高，希望能有很好的成績出現；三，希望同學能參與更多體育項目，在陳瑞祺教授多年，學生參與體育項目的人數並不多，而且有下降的趨勢，希望學生能多參與。

學校體育成績不理想：

參與的人不多，找到精英的機會自然也會少

校內參與運動的人數不多，體育成績自然也會不理想。學校需要大量的基礎，例如全民運動，所有中一學生都參與運動，當中有近四分之一學生出賽，已經不錯了。參與的人不一定是精英，但參與的人不多，找到精英的機會自然也會少，因此學校體育成績的好壞視乎參與的人數，否則對學校體育成績的好處不太樂觀。但亦

抱有期望，參與人數不多，不過只要稍為有上升，相信情況會有好轉。

線上體育課的感受：

雖然不是所有同學參與，但每次問同學，他們都是喘氣。

視乎有沒有充足的簡報製作，校內已經有相當多製作的簡報和影片，加上我們已有文憑試體育科課程，要稍為調整簡報，便能用作網課的材料。雖然停課時間不穩定，但也處理得不錯，除了有理論知識，也有活動在當中，例如拉筋、瑜伽動作、運動步法，並不是所有學校都提供此活動。我也十分滿意現在的情況，因為有了充足的材料，雖然不是所有同學參與，但每次問同學，他們都是喘氣。不過疫情下活動量一定會少，很多調查發現學童的運動狀況不佳，擔心自己的學生也會有運動時數不夠的情況，此外亦會額外在黃昏時間提供網課，希望學生能有更多活動的機會。

運動與感染風險：

不完美，但可接受

數據顯示，校內爆發的機會並不多，而且能即時控制，因為大家都有戴口罩，加上學校的清潔亦十分充足，要不是經常除下口罩，保持雙手清潔，感染風險也不會太高。我們也會提供搓手液，同學都肯自律，經常性會洗手。不完美，但可接受，亦能控制。亦要考慮社區的疫情情況，學校情況亦會有相應調整。戴口罩上體育堂當然會有危險，但我們亦有指引不會做劇烈運動，所謂的危險是因為吸氧量不足，做劇烈運動時需要吸取大量氧氣，只要我們不做劇烈運動，危險性也會相對低，因此亦希望大家能夠合作。

理想的體育課時間：

兼要提高運動素質

體育課大約一小時，單靠運動課，運動量是不足夠的，所以很依賴大家參與課外活動，期望學生能參加校隊增加每天運動量，例如籃球、足球、羽毛球、乒乓球及游泳，以提高自己的運動質素。

新任體育科老師李浩和老師專訪

對學校的第一印象

在他讀書的時候，對於陳瑞祺（喇沙）書院的第一印象是一間運動出色，成績不錯的學校，附近更有著紅燈山的地理優勢，是發展體育的天然優勢，對他而言，山上或附近不同的設施如運動場等雖然可能未必夠大，但卻樂於其中與學生集中在一起訓練的經歷。

與學生的相處

受疫情限制，現時的課堂都以網上授課和面授課堂交替的教學模式，能面對面見到學生的時間其實不多，學生的印象對他而言品性良好，但感覺學生有點內向，但整體來講大家的相處都非常良好，沒有太多相處間磨擦。與較熱衷於運動的學生相處上非常良好，雖然素不相識或未曾任教過，但能感受到他們主動付出去練習的努力，給他的感覺是很成熟和很可靠的男生，亦樂見於此。

在我校的工作的際遇

至於樂，李老師曾任教於男女校，對他而言對比下男校相對會較開放，話題上不用避忌，雖然有時玩得瘋狂，但亦樂見一大班兄弟聚在一起的畫面。至於苦，他認為要經常切換不同的教學模式會感到無所適從，因為交接和流程（如點名）上都非常緊湊，而在網上授課又經常遇到不同的突發事件面對，拍片教學又擔心同學的自律性，未能確保同學能掌握相應的知識，教學進度自然會較慢。

對工作和學生的期望

他期望疫情能盡快過去，樂見學生回到學校上課的畫面。始終體育課依賴身體上的教育，在網上授課和面對面相比，面對面的直接接觸會更能使人與人的關係更加緊密和互動性更強，亦盼望若不能全體回復正常上課，希望先讓適應難度較大的初中學生先回校上課，能而掌握面對面授課才能教導的紀律，行為，品格等等的社會規範，對他們的人生發展亦有莫大的幫助，從而追趕大家因疫情而失去的進度。

對近年學校體育成績表現的看法

他認為現時不但要配合學校的方針，作為老師亦要做好本分，他不認為玩運動每時每刻都要作比較，但希望能有更多人投入於運動上，不但求每個人都一定有運動潛力，要做到校隊的程度，相反若更多人做運動，他認為一定會對學生的學習，健康上都有莫大裨益。未必需要使學校如以往輝煌，但當前更希望學生能透過運動在學習上得益，更期望學生能以此為自己的興趣，未嘗不是一件好事。

李永然老師專訪



李永然老師在我校執教多年，曾教授衆多科目，於下學年正式為本校的副校長，以下為專訪當天的內容：

問：何時開始在我校工作？

李：我在陳瑞祺（喇沙）書院工作十多年了。

問：你一開始對我校學生的感覺及現在的感覺？

李：我一開始覺得我校學生好活潑、有個性、可愛、有人情味、有追求學問的心。到現在的感覺都大致上一樣。

問：工作的苦與樂？

李：我本身很喜歡教書，整體上「樂」多於「苦」。自己要調教心境，學習苦中作樂。最高興當然是與學生互動，並看著學生成長，絕對是這份工作的滿足感。另外，與電腦科及通識科老師們之間的專業交流及合作，令我不斷反思及改進，身處這種充滿教學熱誠的氛圍，會覺得很窩心及感動。

問：對於成為副校的感受和期望？

李：當我得知自己有幸成為副校時，一開始反而覺得擔心，始終這次的崗位轉換，需要頗大勇氣。隨著身邊的同事的鼓勵及學生的有趣反應，擔心亦開始減退。

期望我校學生能夠於六年的中學生活中，獲得成長的滋潤，讀書表現有所突破，將來能夠成為一個有誠信、明辨慎思、有理想、有能力貢獻社會的人。

問：你對於教育局對通識的改革？

李：最初得知消息當然覺得可惜。我由第一屆通識開始任教到現在，自己及通識老師們都花了很多時間及氣力預備通識科教學，由最初的探索階段，到近期開始掌握較有成效的教學心得。感謝老師團隊的努力及配合，公開試成績亦越見進步。

然而，公民與社會發展科的替代，當中亦保留了不少通識的課程理念及宗旨。因此，我對於公民科亦抱有不少希望。希望學生可以從中獲得豐碩的學習成果，包括成為獨立思考者、關注世界、國家及香港的不同社會議題、從多角度探究當代課題、學習尊重及包容的態度等。期望學生可以享受及投入課堂，並於畢業後可以成為有見識的人。

學校圖書館大翻新——李瑞芬老師專訪

簡介

學校圖書館的翻新工程已於早前竣工，翻新後的圖書館以嶄新形象投入服務，延續以往供同學閱讀及學習的用途。是次專訪邀請了李老師講解圖書館的翻新工程，以下為當天專訪的內容。

緣由

問及校方當初決定翻新圖書館的原因，李老師解釋當時一些舊生希望為母校作出貢獻，他們留意到圖書館經過一段時日的運作後不少地方變得較為殘舊，於是捐款令圖書館得以翻新，期望圖書館能夠以新形象示人及添置電子器材供同學使用。

特色及改動

李老師指出工程的主要改動是圖書館的活動空間較以往大，放置書籍所佔的空間則有所縮減，亦著重於燈光及顏色的設計。為此圖書館的藏書量較以往減少約三分之一，以騰出更多空間讓同學在館內自修、閱書及使用電腦。同時學校亦購置了新電腦及平板電腦，好讓同學在圖書館內除了閱讀實體的館藏外，亦可運用電子器材閱讀電子書及瀏覽學習相關的網頁。



預期與實際結果

李老師指翻新工程的實際支出與預期相若，未有超出預算。至於工程進度則受疫情及各方面的工程因素影響，令工期較預期稍為延長，但最終翻新工程的效果理想。

教職員及同學的意見

李老師指很多老師反映圖書館翻新過後燈光明亮，環境舒服，對新圖書館有良好感覺。談到同學的意見，李老師反過來詢問了編輯的感覺，編輯認為圖書館翻新後有更多座位，整體設計美觀，相信各位同學體驗過後亦會有相似的感覺。

期望

談到校方的期望，李老師指學校期望通過這次翻新令同學感覺到閱讀是舒服的，也期望同學認為圖書館是一個適合學習的地方，不論是書籍或是網上資源也能夠提供給同學。李老師亦希望同學們喜歡圖書館，多使用圖書館的服務。

飯堂大翻新

翻新構思

過往飯堂只會用於吃飯或一些活動舉辦的用途，但始終場地規模所限，學校可以舉辦活動的地方亦有所限制，大多主要都在禮堂，或於八樓多用途室和五樓的講座室舉辦，但過往禮堂的活動排期較密，學生可能要走到高層也會感到不方便，地方所容納的學生亦有限，因此校方希望透過翻新能夠靈活運用飯堂的大空間，達到多用途的效果，亦提升飯堂設施的靈活性和場地的彈性而容納不同學級的學生同時去舉辦活動，翻新過後亦能提供更舒適的環境給學生休息和放寬活動舉辦地點的限制。適逢教育局正批准學校特別工程的申請，亦從其他地方尋找到財政支援下而萌起翻新的念頭。



隔開兩邊空間容納不同班別的學生進行各自活動，亦能保持半室內的效果。

飯堂入口對望亦拆除了壁報板，保留當年完整的石屎牆身建築特色，而不止於已經線灰油油的牆身，回復過往開校以來學校當初的面貌模樣，使舊生返母校時能夠懷緬過去的回憶之餘，亦能夠鋪陳50周年的歷史給同學去認識。亦有賴有一位家長的支持自費捐贈，使飯堂整套的冷氣設施得以翻新，使學生在夏日炎炎的日子下不單只有風扇也能享受冷氣而營造舒適的環境給學生休息或進行活動。

翻新特色

不僅由學校自費和政府津貼下於在飯堂設立不同的電子設施，如在入口處安裝了兩處熒幕和投影器，皆支援無線操作和有線接駁，無線上網連接手提電腦或手機下就能夠進行熒幕投射作教學或講座等等的用途，方便講者能夠例如邊拿著平板邊指導教學的操作而提升教學的彈性。新安裝的音響設備亦支援聲效，能夠和熒幕投射的畫面的同步運作。燈光亦有所加強使能夠配合活動室舉辦活動的效果。場地所佈置的座位和桌子亦從長桌椅翻新成獨立桌椅，在安排講座等活動的時候能夠移走桌椅而重新佈置去容納更多學生。金屬的閘門亦能夠使學生

翻新的滿意程度

校方對於這次的翻新大體上感到滿意，能夠提供一個更舒適的環境給學生溫習，尤其對於一眾中六準備應試時回校溫習是一個良好的地點。唯一美中不足的地方是由於飯堂是半戶外的地方形式，容易有打風下雨而未能夠安裝有較良好隔音效果的木製間板，因為一旦安裝會容易出現發霉的情況，因此只能安裝隔音效果相對較差的金屬間板。而學生和教職員亦有反映對於翻新的飯堂就感到滿意。

牧養人靈 觸動心弦—— 生命教育回顧與前瞻

李寶珠副校長

學校一直本著喇沙精神辦學，以天主基督為中心，並以信德、熱誠、群體合作的力量完成以人為本的教育。除了智育外，亦著重照顧學生在德、體、群、美、靈的發展，旨於幫助學生發現及實踐人文和福音價值，發展成完善的人。為此，學校自2018至19學年開始加強發展生命教育，從知識、情感、意志及行動層面協助學生反思自己與「天」（宗教和宇宙）、「人」（社會及人際關係）、「物」（物質和環境）、「我」（自我）的關係，以探索生命的意義及培育正面價值和態度。有賴全校教師、同學之積極參與，學校的生命教育開展三個學年至今，已在專業發展、課程及活動上已漸見成果。



教師專業發展

本校李寶珠副校長、德育及公民教育主任關玉燕老師、特殊教育需要統籌主任劉楊美芳老師和升學及就業輔導主任黃永坤老師代表全校教師團隊在2018至19年度參與由教育局委托香港教育大學宗教教育與心靈教育中心承辦的「協助中學規劃生命教育計劃」，透過一系列的專家分享及學校個案交流工作坊，掌握推行生命教育的策略及技巧。其後，他們亦將所得知識及經驗帶回學校，開展校本先導課程，透過計劃得到具豐富經驗的李瑞華校長及羅世光校長到校支援課程設計。而羅校長亦另外為本校舉辦生命教育工作坊，進一步將課程理念推廣至全體教師。



課程發展

配合上述計劃，學校由2019至2020年起由關玉燕老師作統籌，循序漸進地發展校本生命教育課程。首年特別在中一其中兩班別試行先導課程，在校本設計上強調感恩、珍惜和關愛的正面態度。然後正式在第二學年推展至全級中一實行，並改為雙課節安排，讓老師和同學有更充足時間進行活動，更深入地探索「生命影響生命」的主題。課程開展至今已有三年寶貴經驗及回饋，學校來年將會進一步把課程由初中擴大至高中的中四級進行，增設相應的校本內容，以回應心智發展更成熟、對生命意義有更多探求的高中同學之需要。內容上，學校一直發掘多元議題，例如了解自我、認識情緒、人際溝通、欺凌、生命價值等等，讓學生從多角度思考生命。



多元活動

除了課程，全校不同組別——包括升學及就業輔導組、輔導組、德育及公民教育組、宗教教育組、體育組、級統籌等等亦不時跨組協作，就生命教育的主題盡心安排多元活動，例如全體牧民組每年合作籌辦中六的祝福及派遣禮，除了送上老師和同學悉心設計的特色匙扣，更由初中師弟親手製作畢業禮物盒給應屆畢業師兄，突出學校團體精神的承傳意義；在2018至2019年的典禮後更設置雪糕車為畢業同學送上甜美溫馨的祝福；而2019至2020年則動員了全校人員拍攝鼓勵影片給中六同學；在2020至2021年就設計了我校特色口罩給畢業同學使用，突顯生命教育感恩與關愛之情。此外，學校亦針對不同級別舉辦活動，譬如歡迎中一新生的迎新小禮物、歡送和向中六同學打氣的各樣驚喜活動等等。學生透過各式活動親身感受和實踐人與人的懇摯互動，對人際情誼和生命之熱誠有更深刻而豐富的體會。





展望

本校這三年來推動生命教育已漸見成熟，展望未來在以上三大範疇持續發展，繼續鼓勵教師專業發展；深化課程內容；促進更多跨組別活動，亦將在現時橫向的級別為主模式加入更多縱向的跨級別層面內容，推動全校參與，進一步實踐本校教育願景，協助學生活出豐盛人生。



六年有感：男校

實話實說：「來來去去，出入旦暮。我什麼都不能帶走，卻什麼都跟着「蔡曉東」走，因為年月點點、片片、句句、幕幕中的『因素』都成了我現在的一撇一捺。沒什麼話能留下於此校，倒是我撿到何物，領略何事。」

競選學生會是偶然轉為命運的一刻，如我當初毅然決意踏入這校園：

「那年十二歲仍是小學生，每天放學後坐着校巴回家。我在這個歲數，似乎已經漸漸蛻變成青少年。在校巴上不再只顧着與同座嬉鬧，倒是眼巴巴看着窗外的街景，童心裏着的青春正逐步破出。

猶記得一幕校巴外的畫面，每次只是上坡轉彎的幾秒鐘，我已看得目不轉睛。鄰近的男校也開始放學，清一色的白色襯衫，長的袖、短的袖，長的更顯紳士，短的卻更活力。稚嫩的喉結下打着黑色的領帶，標誌的黃紋映襯着，格外奪目耀人。下身雖是普通的黑色西褲，但經過學生巧妙的搭配，小改大造，把腿部的線條若隱若現地展現出來。他們穿着擦得閃亮的皮鞋，哪怕只是平凡的黑鞋子，他們也可以從中添上一道銀光。剛到的夕陽，為他們帶來更無限的遐想，一個個背着艷陽落坡而下，灑脫的一身，幾個幾個合着走，有笑有談，不時捉弄對方，正裝校服從不拘謹，仿佛他們身態行徑總能隨着他們的態度轉變。一幕青春的畫面深深烙印在我當時的腦海裏，總是幻想着自己穿上那一套校服，認識更大的世界，便決意要考上這學校。

向來我所認定的、確定的，我便會拚力地爭取，果然這一次也不出乎我所料，我如願考上這所男校。而就在同一天我對這所學校的幻想也如雪球般越滾越大，從一身截然不同的校服，不一樣的校園，以至到不認識的同學和老師，眾多的不同之處都令我很好奇。

然而幻想總是美好的，現實中這所男校實在有太多乳臭未乾的，他們只是一班換了中



學校服的小學生，仍然活在母親的庇蔭底下。男校裏沒有人是饒有心計的，該說他們太愚蠢還是太純真？一個笑話足以讓他們快樂整個數學堂。我在他們眼中總是格格不入，是超脫的思想令我暫時能夠冷眼旁觀，再進而扮演他們的角色，融入他們當中。

我多盼望這些小男孩能夠長大，能有與我談心的能耐。

或許是他們離開了家，沒有人再管束着他們，學校便成了他們的家，嘮叨的老師成為了他們的第二位母親。這兒的老師總是不辭勞苦地一次又一次導引他們成人，藉着簡單的中文書總能吐出許多的肺腑之言。亦只有這些「媽媽」發現我的與眾不同，總是利用更低調的方式教導著我，我總能從他們看似無意的話語中，發現弦外之音。我敬佩他們，欣賞他們對教育的熱忱，在他們的眼裏，我只是個混入孩童堆的少年。哪怕這群男孩子只是聽進一部份，他們便能安份點，課堂也再不用因為掛在天花板上的玻璃光管被弄碎，而需要停下來讓別人來訓話。

隨著年月過去，個子都與成人們無別，他們的稚氣也幸好隨着他們的跌跌碰碰而洩走。可我始終不是剛來到這所男校的那個小大人，我總是比他們多一份成熟。這份早慧，能讓我放下多一點的身段，在這深交了一小圈較為成熟的人。我以為我在他們當中的思想是最為傑出，可是他們正直的人格總能在思想衝擊時提醒着我，要多一份謙卑，多一份保留。

熱汗濕透了白衣，褲子在磨擦之間劃出一道道白痕，皮鞋也破出一個洞來，激昂鬥志在球場上滴下點點奮鬥後豁達的汗水。我們在懵懂的青春途中，在這所學校撞撞跌跌，體會到痛的滋味，才更懂得珍惜與體諒。

應該感激他們，是他們那股衝勁，造就了我們最寶貴的校園時光，使回憶變得更有意義。

一套校服將走過六年男校生活，它並不是枯燥無味的，而是隨著我們的態度而演變着。昔日是衣不稱身，提醒着我們要成長，才能襯上這套校服；如今是貼服稱身，提醒著我們要反省，才能對起這套校服。

脫下校服，離開母校，步入社會，沒有人會再理會或體諒你只是個黃口小兒，亦不會再出現第三個「媽媽」。這時候，只有在男校裏結交的他們，會無怨地為你一醉解千愁，逐山隨波流，千盞來去昔情留，直至東方之既白。

我要繼續盡我的份，穿好整齊校服，瀟灑灑灑地與他們一起下坡。或者不遠之處，也會有某個小學生雙目放光，心生羨慕。」——《六年有感：男校》
