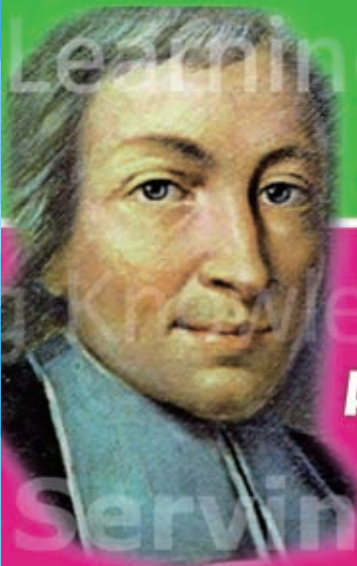

我們的學校由喇沙會修士於一九六九年創辦，四十年來都是以學生為本，有教無類，學校以關愛為心，希望通過人文及基督教育，使每一個學生都可以發揮潛能，五育兼修，能夠具備自我學習能力，更可以終身學習，達致全人發展。

學校的辦學理念，與今天的教育改革理念不謀而合，一樣是以培育未來社會所需要的精英為己任。未來的世界，是急變的體系，知識更新快，資訊科技你追我趕，全球一體化，人物事務愈趨繁複，在劇烈的競爭下，學校期望所培育的學生，不是單一範疇的精英，而是具備多元能力的文武全才精英。

為了完成使命，學校除了重視學生的學業成績，同時亦要培養學生各方面的能力，所以盡力改善課程及校園設施，希望學生可以樂於學習知識，立志於服務大眾，可以同心協力，建構學校成為一個學習社群。

今個學年，在回顧了前三年的學校發

展計劃後，雖然學校每年中文和英文科會考和高考成绩平均合格率都超過90%，亦有很好的優良數目及正增值的表現，但為了增加學生未來所需要的獨立學習能力，學生中英文程度必須有進一步的提升，所以提升語文程度成為今個三年學校發展計劃的首個關注項目。

為了提升同學語文程度，中英兩科老師以學生為本，加強優化本科的課程教案設計，使學生兼顧讀寫聽說的發展，亦配合地籌辦多種課外活動，包括有閱讀分享，寫作訓練班，英語週，普通話週，亦鼓勵學生參加辯論、演講、話劇、朗誦和創作等等的文藝活動。

為幫助學生學好英文，學校將保留英語小班制度，中一五班英語堂分十組上課，中二至中五亦每級五班各分六組上課。中一至中三更各設一班每星期一次的課後英語補習班，其次更設中一午間英語閱讀時段，由外籍老師負責教導，同時亦強化英語環境及所有的英語課外活動，譬如英語早會，英語





日，英語學習中心活動等等。

另外，在檢討學校過往學與教的效能時，發覺雖然絕大部份的中一學生都屬第一組別，但學習差異不斷擴大，現在的策略，雖然可以使所有的學生在中學會考中有良好的成績，但仍然有進步的空間，因此學校設定的第二個關注項目，是提升我們學生的學習態度，學習技巧和知識，務求使學生的學習差異可以縮短及在學業上有更好的表現。

為了幫助學生學習態度的改變，學校為各級舉辦了有關的學習方法講座，輔導組更為中一每班分別舉辦了一天的學習日營，成立了大哥哥朋輩輔導計劃及老師啟導學生分組計劃，訓導組亦特別設訂了課後學習態度改善班，期望學生的學習態度及方法有正面的改善。其次負責學務的相關小組，更分別推出了不同的拔尖補底課後班，務求上下一心，使同學們在學業上有更好的表現。

重視學業表現之外，再前望未來社會對多元精英的需求性，學校的第三個關注項目是發

展可以提升學生正面價值的全方位學習經歷，期望我們的學生除了優於課堂學習外，亦可獲益於學校特別鼓勵的課堂外活動，他日可以成為真正的文武全才精英。

為達到上述的目的，負責德育及公民教育的老師推出了很多配合社會所需的課堂外活動，譬如支援苗圃行動的四川震後建校行動，籌辦國民教育活動，組織環保大使，清潔大使及禁毒團隊等等。負責課外活動及就業輔導的老師，亦計劃了不少的參觀活動，比賽項目，外遊學習，職業介紹講座及社區服務，學校更特別改動星期三的課堂時間，提早一堂放學，使更多的同學可以參加不同的全方位學習經歷，將來可以有更多的成功機會。

陳瑞祺（喇沙）書院四十年來，在喇沙精神的帶領下，在校友，家長及社會各友好的支持下，學校在不斷地完善，學校的老師和學生，將排除萬難，向前望，不畏縮，手牽手，闖高峰！

CSK 40 – Looking forward without fear

Climbing high hand in hand Together

Our school was founded by the La Salle Brothers in 1969. In these forty years, human, Christian or holistic education is what the school provides. Our teachers are fully committed to nurturing students' potential so that they can learn self-learning and will continue a life-long process to contribute to our society in the future.



Our school vision conforms to that of the modern educational reform. We understand that the person to succeed in the future must be the one capable of mastering more than one key learning area. Therefore, we planned a balanced curriculum to nurture our students to become persons with diversified talents.

After a review of our past school development plan, although the average passing percent of our students in Chinese and English in the HKCEE is higher than 90% every year, the school still include enhancing students' language proficiency as one of the three major concerns for the coming three years. It is because higher language proficiency is fundamental to students' independent learning and life-long learning.

In order to enhance students' proficiency in languages, our English and Chinese teachers have organized a wide variety of activities, like reading sharing, writing classes, English Week, Putonghua Week. Students are also encouraged to join different inter-school competitions, for example, debates, English drama, speech and writing competitions. We also believe a strong foundation in the English language is vital to our students. Thus, we practice small-classing teaching in Form 1 English lessons and provide an English-rich learning environment in the school. In order to help Form 1 students immerse themselves in their learning as soon as possible, a summer bridging programme is launched every year. Our NET teacher conducts oral lessons and runs compulsory reading sessions during lunchtime for Form 1 students. Moreover, there is an English Learning Centre in the school. Students visit the centre during their leisure time to play board games, read books, watch movies or listen to songs.

Our second major concern is to cater for learners' diversity through enhancing students' attitude, skills and knowledge in learning. As there are students of mixed abilities in each class, our teachers keep on designing a range of learning activities for our students so that each of them can get the most out of his learning time. For example, the school organizes many after-school tutorial classes and gifted-education programmes. We believe they would learn more efficiently if they have improvement in their learning attitudes and skills. With this aim, the school organizes many talks on instructing students in effective ways of learning and revising. Our teachers also take a proactive role in counseling students. Under the care of the pastoral teachers, the school organizes peer counseling programme, counseling day-camps, Teacher-student Mentorship scheme and Attitude Improvement Classes so that students can stay on their right track.

With the implementation of the New Senior Curriculum, students are required to be exposed to different other learning experiences. In order to achieve this aim, our school encourages students to learn beyond classrooms and our third major concern is to foster students' positive values through life-wide learning experiences. To achieve the above target, our Moral and Civic Education teachers have launched many activities for students. For example, activities related to environmental conservation, national identity and drug abuse. In addition, the Career teachers have organized a lot of job-related talks, visits and career planning activities. Besides, we encourage students to join different extra-curricular activities after school to widen their horizons. As a support to the major concern, the school allocated a time slot for other learning Experiences every Wednesday after school and we hope that students will gain different experiences which are inspiring for their growth.

With the support of parents, old boy and the community, we have no fear in facing the future challenges and we will climb high up to the summit of success hand in hand.

4 teachers of Marycove School visited CSK to observe our lesson for Form 2 on a topic of the Chinese Culture, "Chopsticks".

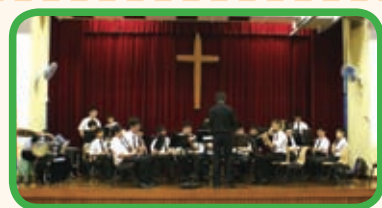




January 17, 2009

[Overseas Learning Partnership] English Summer Study Tour 2009 (Oxford University, UK)

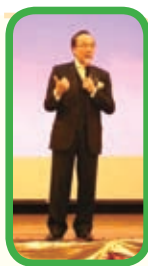
